Social Development

(PD)

Learning skills: cut out the puppets carefully (use 'People who help us' puppets available).
 Can you pretend to be a person who helps us or a superstar? What actions/movements do they make?

Understanding the World

(UW)

People who help us
 at the different 'People who help us' puppets.
 Can you think of your child:
 - How do they help us?
 - Where do they work?
 - When you grow up what do you want to do?

You could play a game with the puppets. Ask your child a question like, 'This person holds a lollipop stick'. Then see if your child can point/find the correct person and tell you how they help us!

Communication and Language

(CL)

Can you sing the 'People who help us' nursery rhymes?
 Can you tell an adult the story of 'Whatever Next!?'
 How did the story begin? What happened next? What happened at the end?
 Can you tell a story using the 'People who help us' puppets?
 - You could get all the family involved. Each family member could be a character and play a part. How exciting!

Personal Social Emotional Development (PSED)

Ask your child:
 - What things do you like to do?
 - When you grow up, what do you want to do?
 - Why do you want to be a ...?'

(EAD)

- Make a Firefighter's hat Use the instructions available to help you make it. Use resources you have at home.

(EAD)

Mathematics

(M)

- How many people are in the shapes? Can you count how many people are in the shapes? Touch each one as you count. Say how many. Can you recognise the shapes?
- Who has more? Who has fewer? Pretend you have been to the supermarket and you have a shopping bag full of food (the grown up has a shopping bag and the child has a shopping bag). Count the food items in the shopping bags. Who has more food? Who has fewer food items?

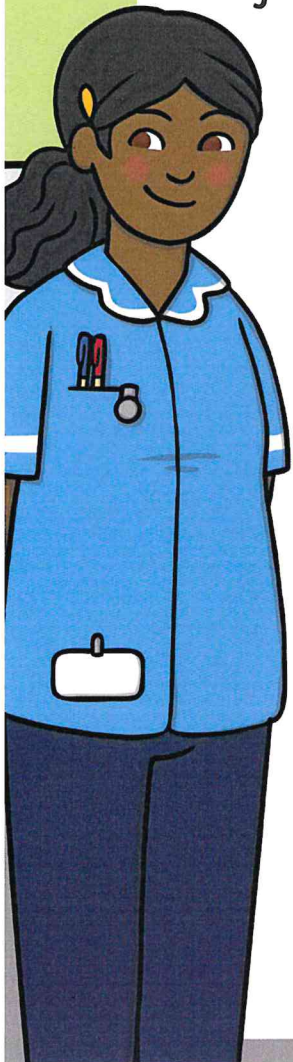

Paper Plate Firefighters Helmet

Supplies

- 1 paper plate per hat
- Card
- Paint
- Felt tip pens
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Black felt tip



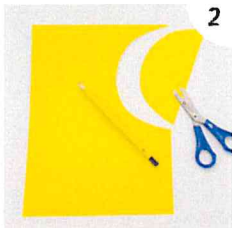
- Glue stick
- PVA glue



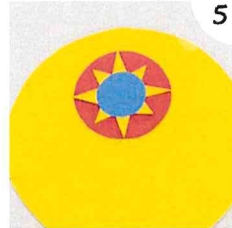
- 1 Carefully cut out the centre circle of the paper plate without damaging the outer rim. Keep the Circle as this will be the front your helmet.



- 4 Now design a badge for the front of the hat! Then cut this out.



- 2 Draw and cut out a shallow semi-circle from the card. This will form the rim for the front of the hat.



- 5 Using the glue stick, attach the badge to the top part of the hat. You may want to draw around the outline of the badge, using a felt tip pen.



- 3 Paint both parts of the paper plate, along with the card, then leave to dry.



- 6 Now attach the top part of the hat to the circular rim. To do this, first cut a small slit in opposite sides of the rim. Then slot the top part of the hat into these and stick in place at an angle.



- 7 Next stick the semi-circle shaped piece of card to the front of the hat using PVA glue.

Paper Plate Firefighters Helmet



Supplies

- 1 paper plate per hat
- Card
- Paint
- Felt tip pens

Step 1. Carefully cut out the centre circle of the paper plate without damaging the outer rim. Keep the Circle as this will be the front your helmet.



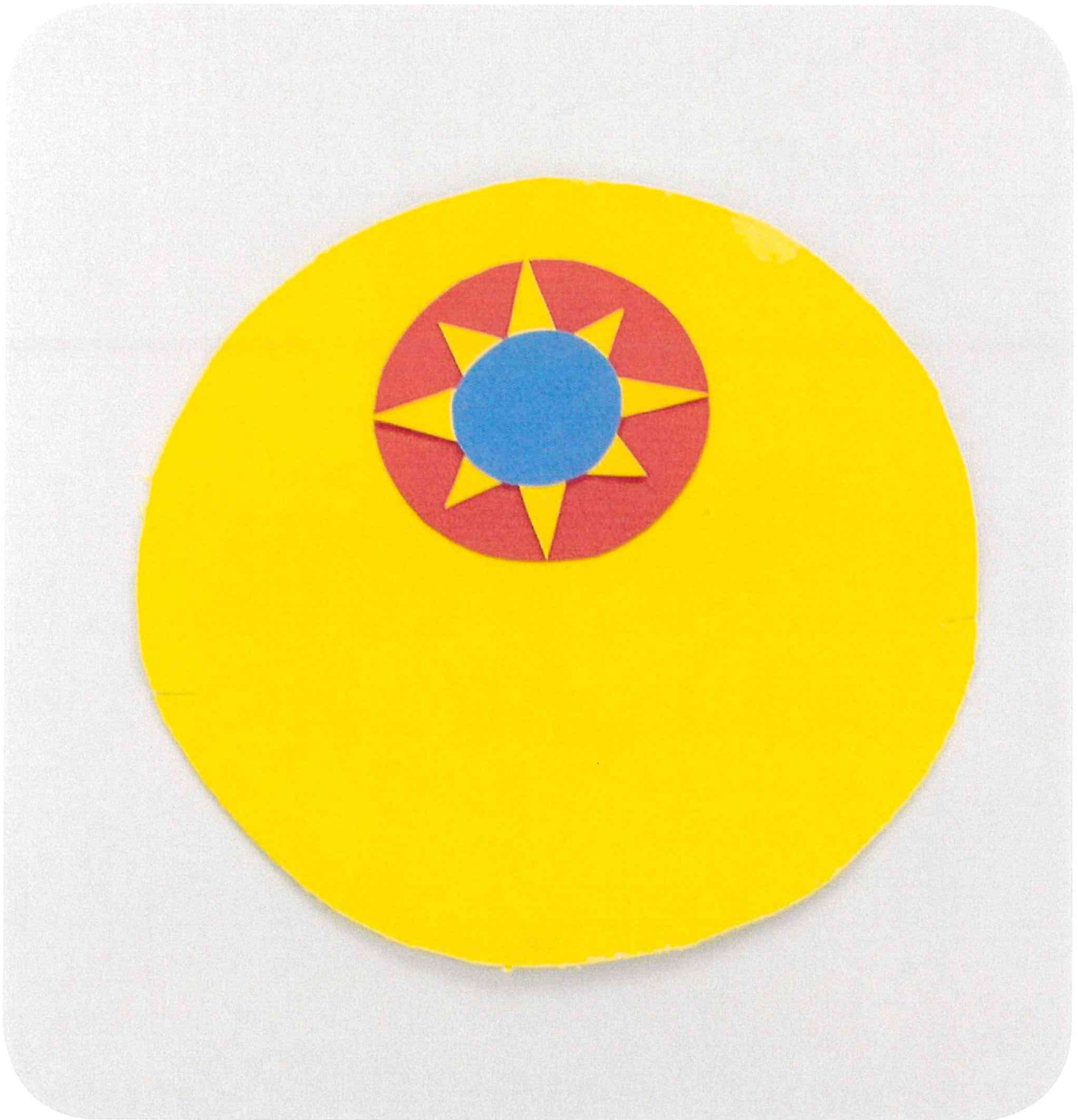
Step 2. Draw and cut out a shallow semi-circle from the card. This will form the rim for the front of the hat.

Step 4. Now design a badge for the front of the hat! Then cut this out.



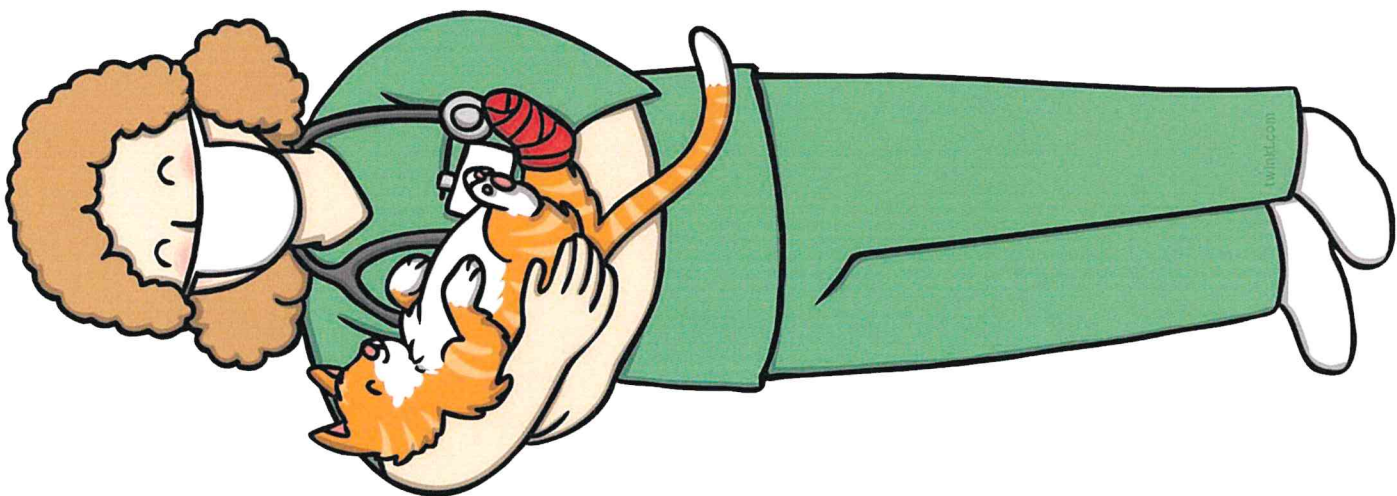
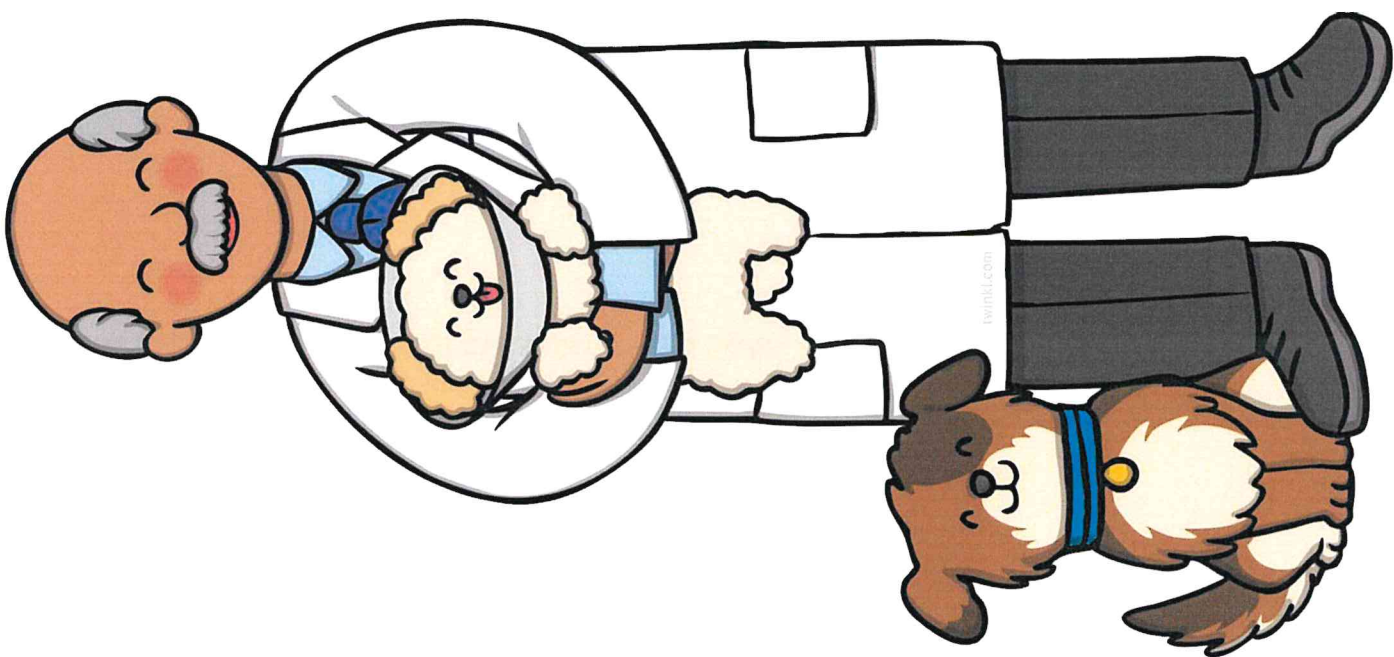
Step 5. Using the glue stick, attach the badge to the top part of the hat. You may want to draw around the outline of the badge, using a felt tip pen.

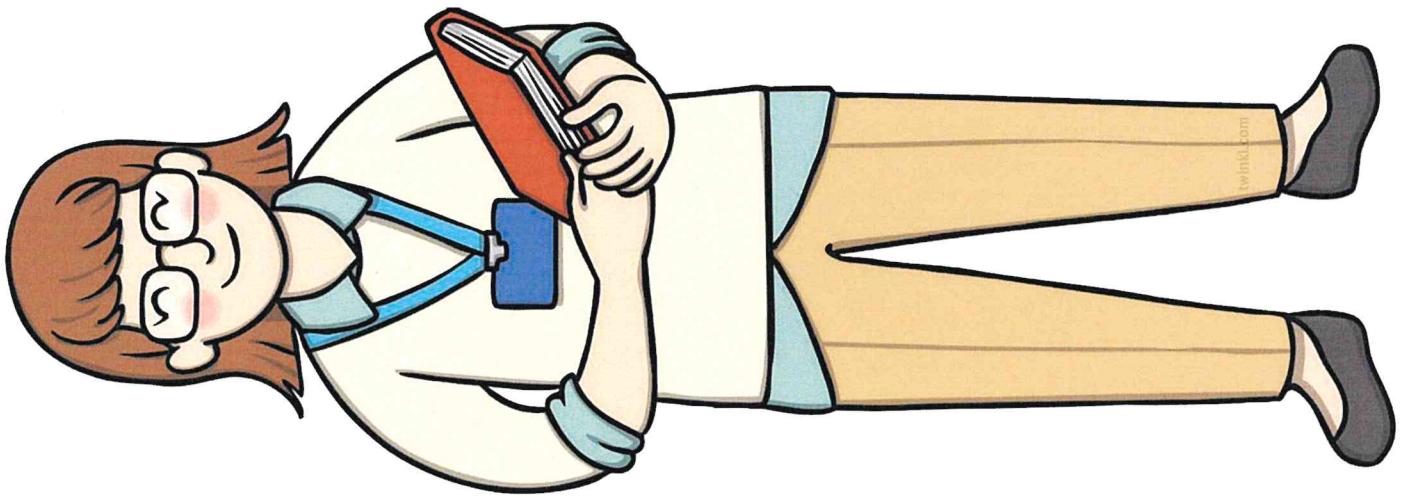
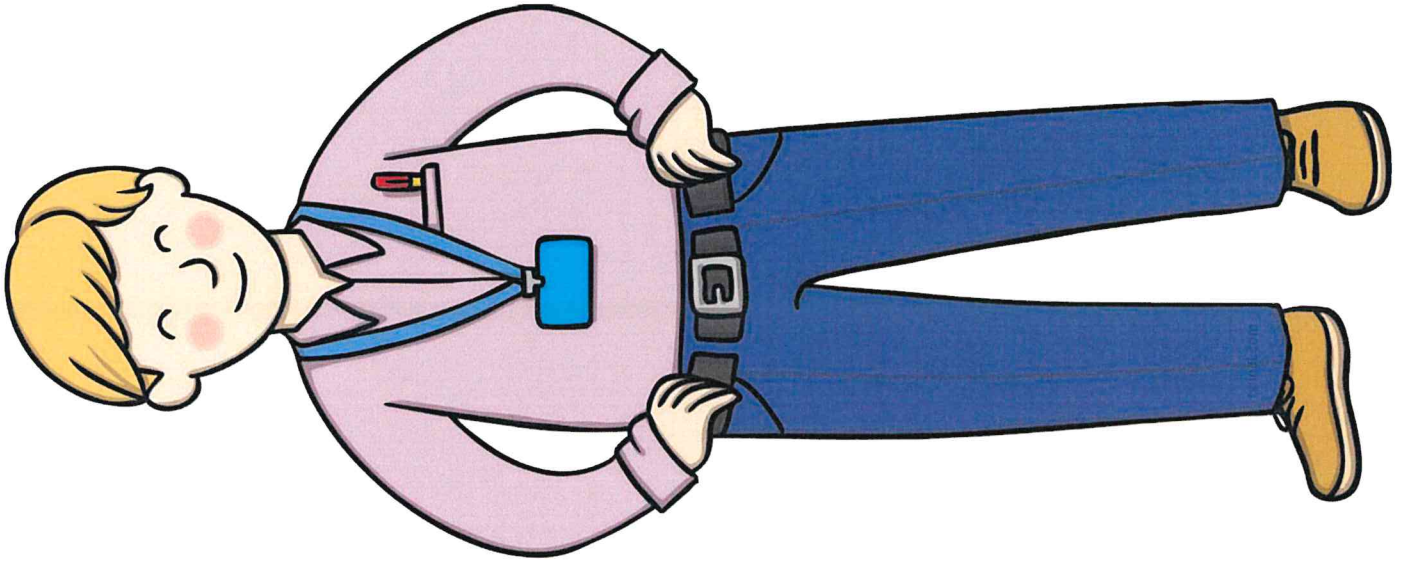


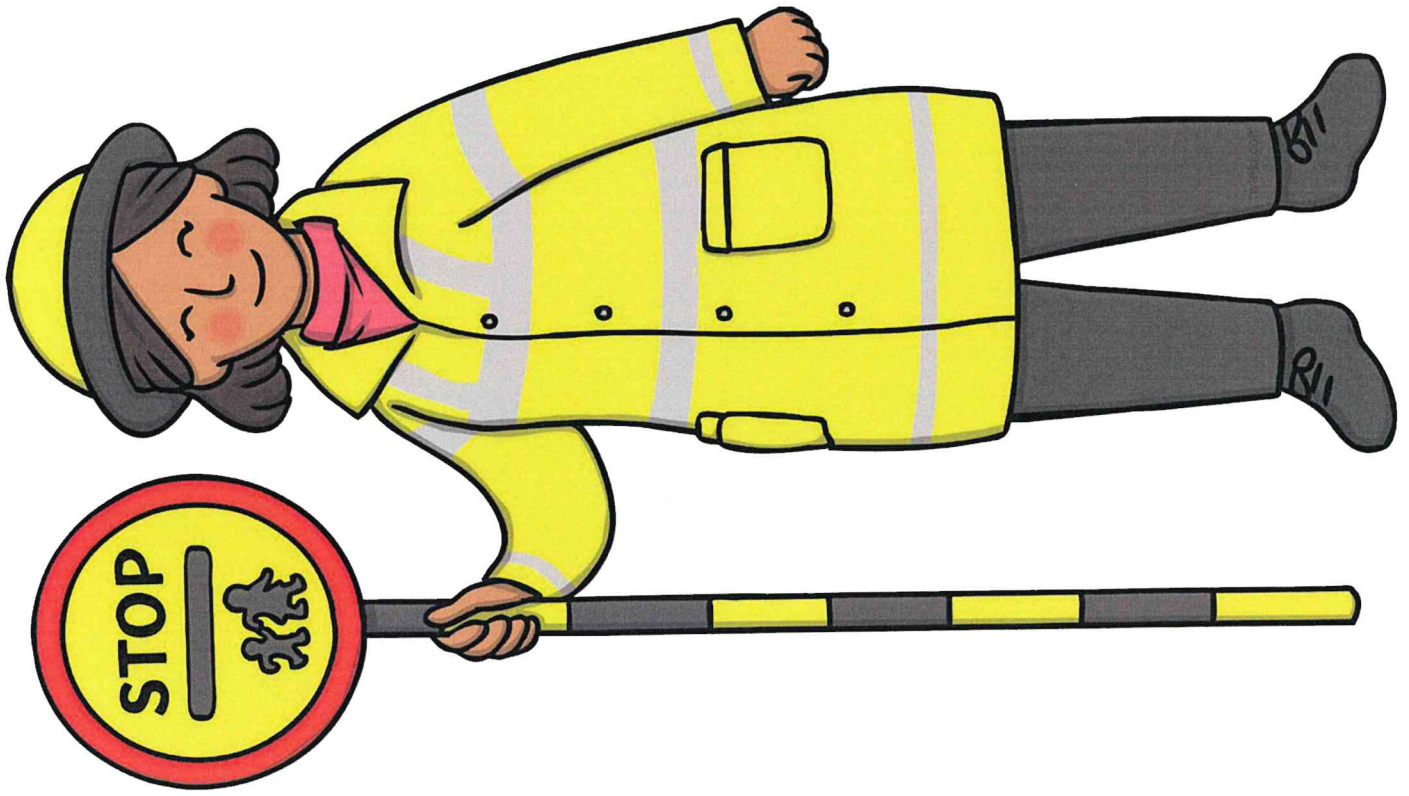
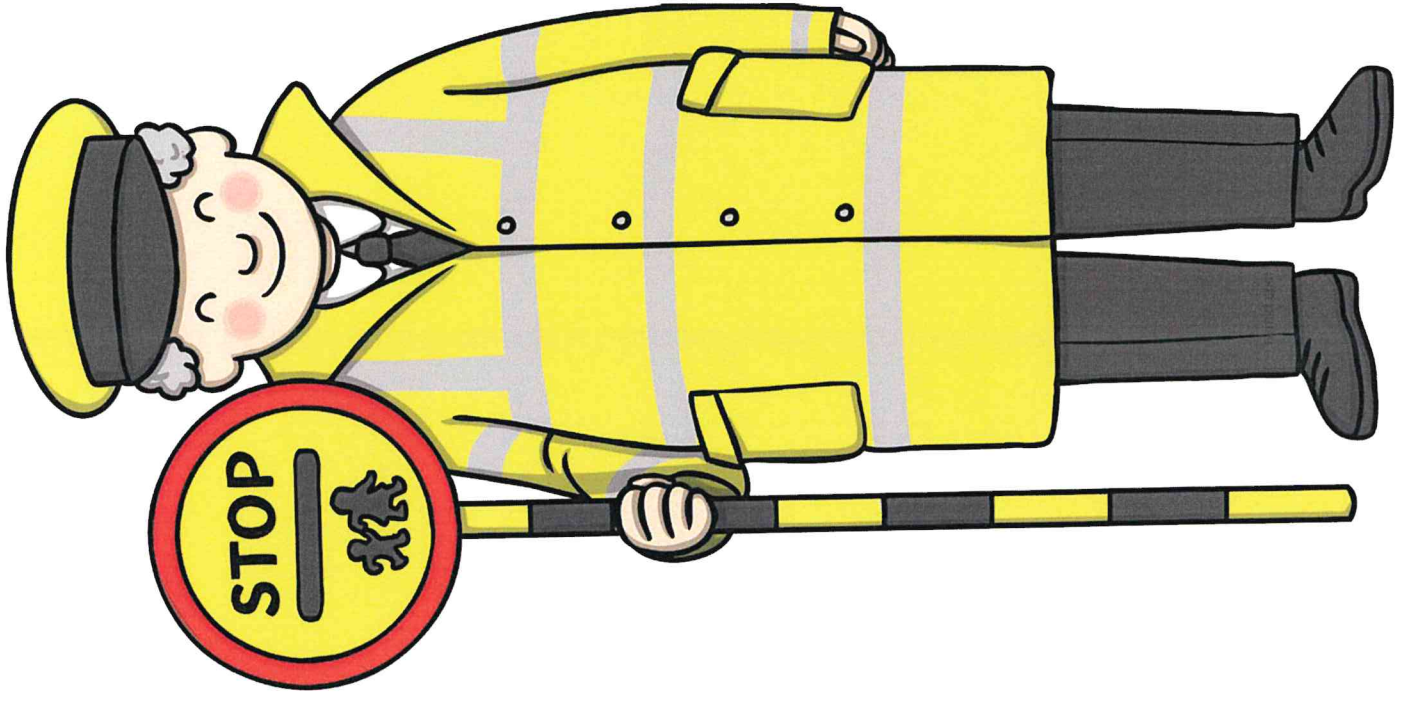
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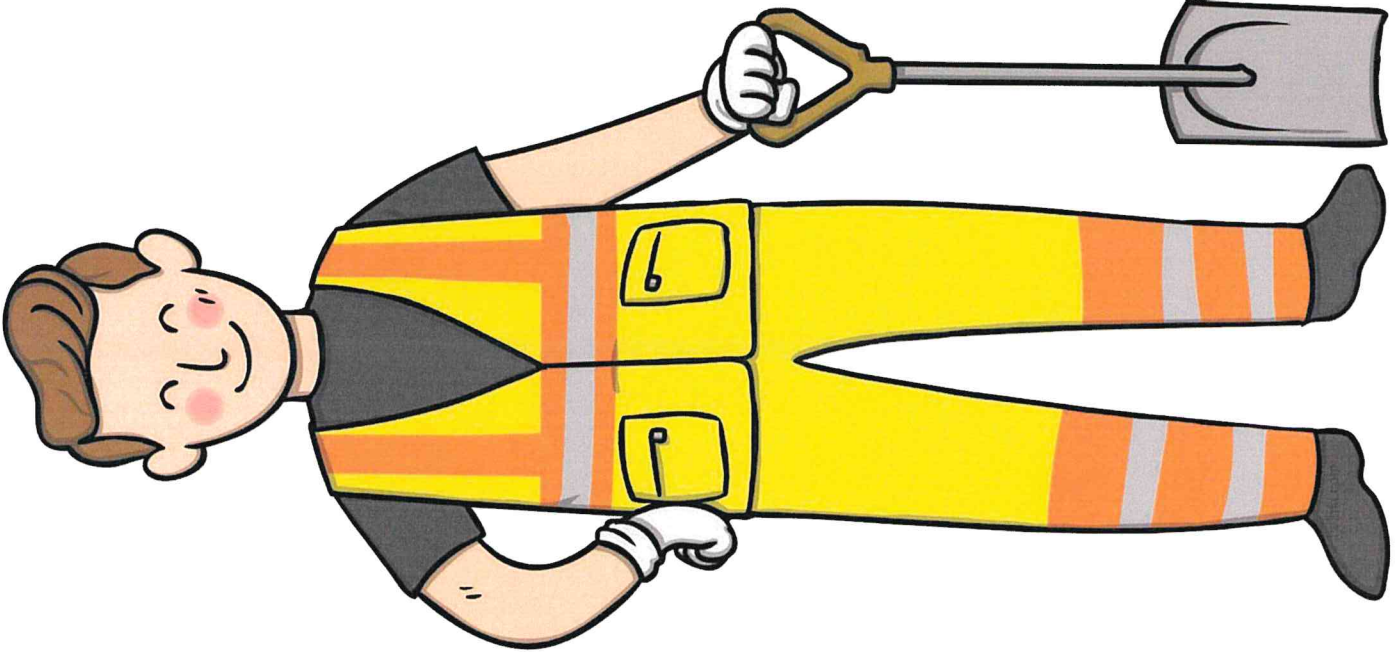


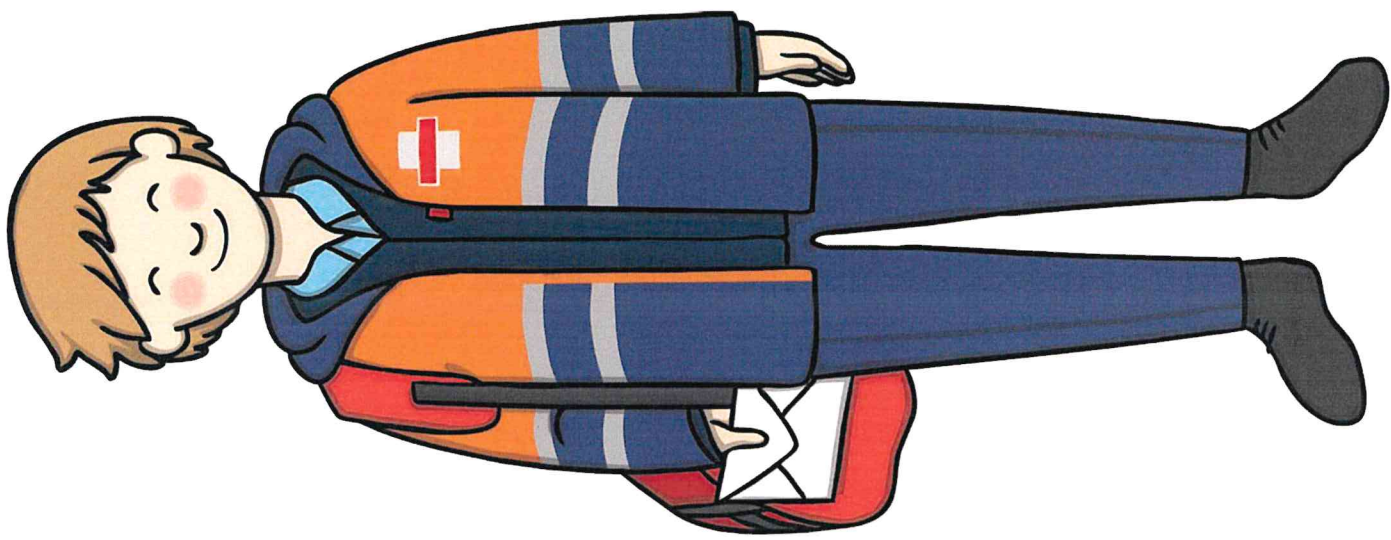
Step 7. Next stick the semi-circle shaped piece of card to the front of the hat using PVA glue.



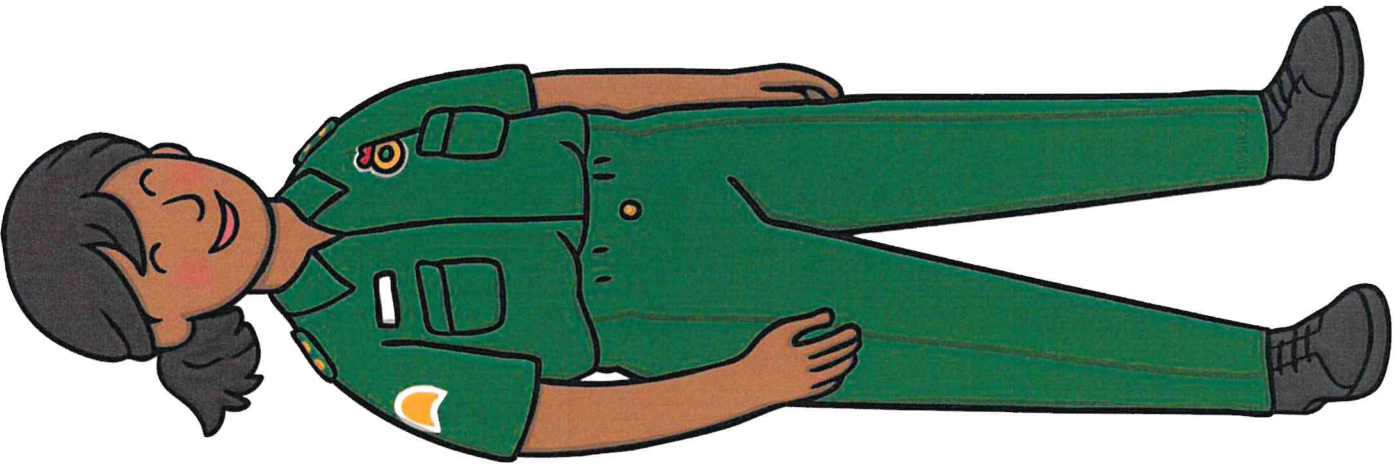
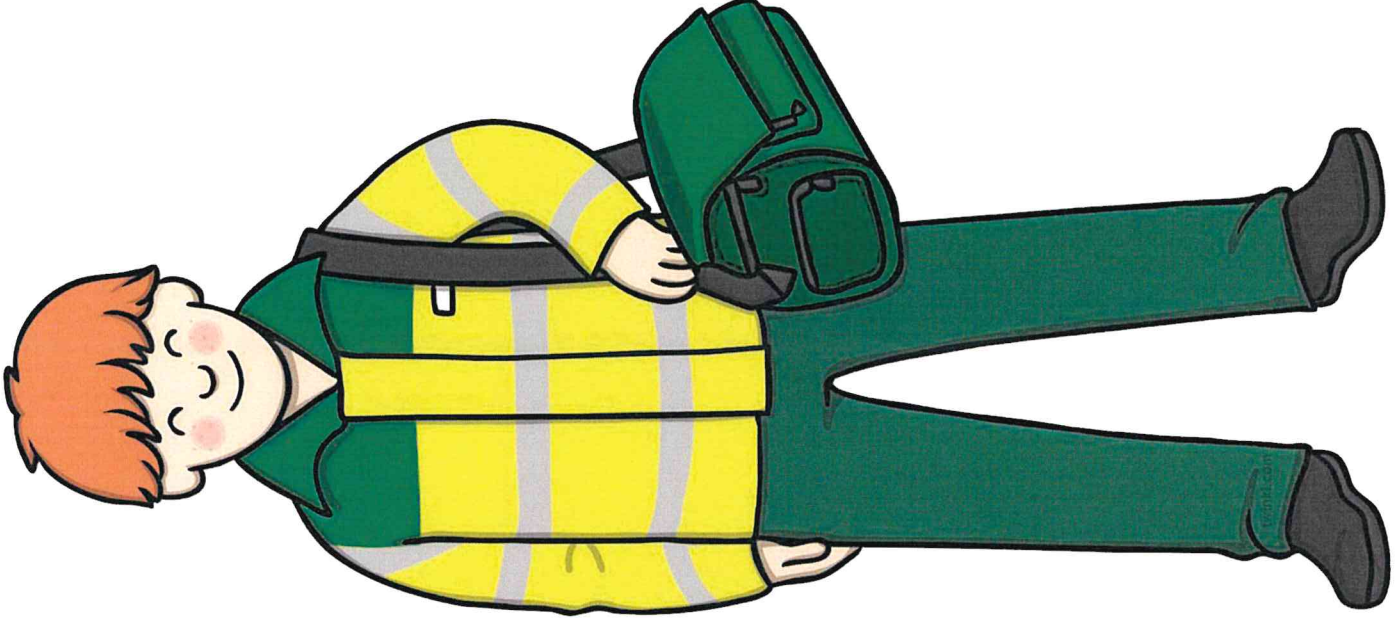


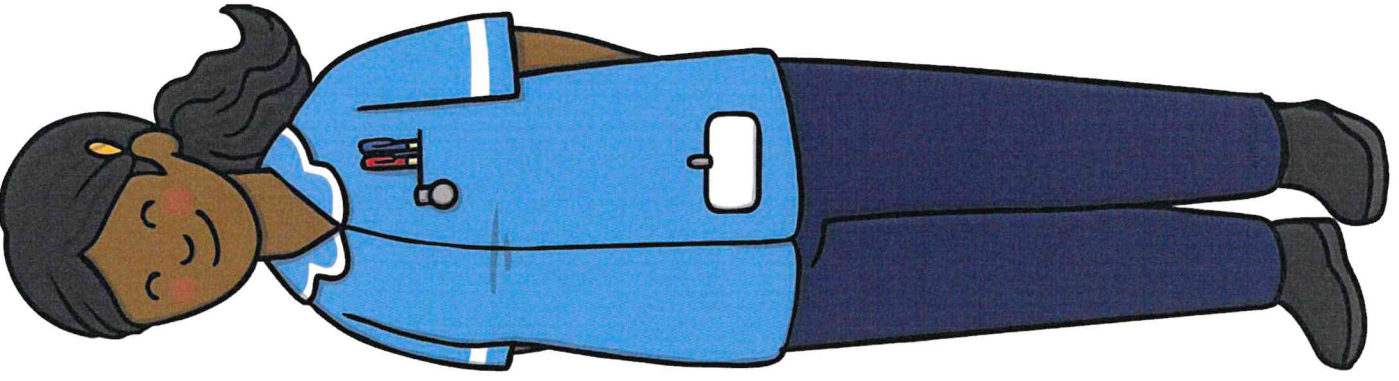
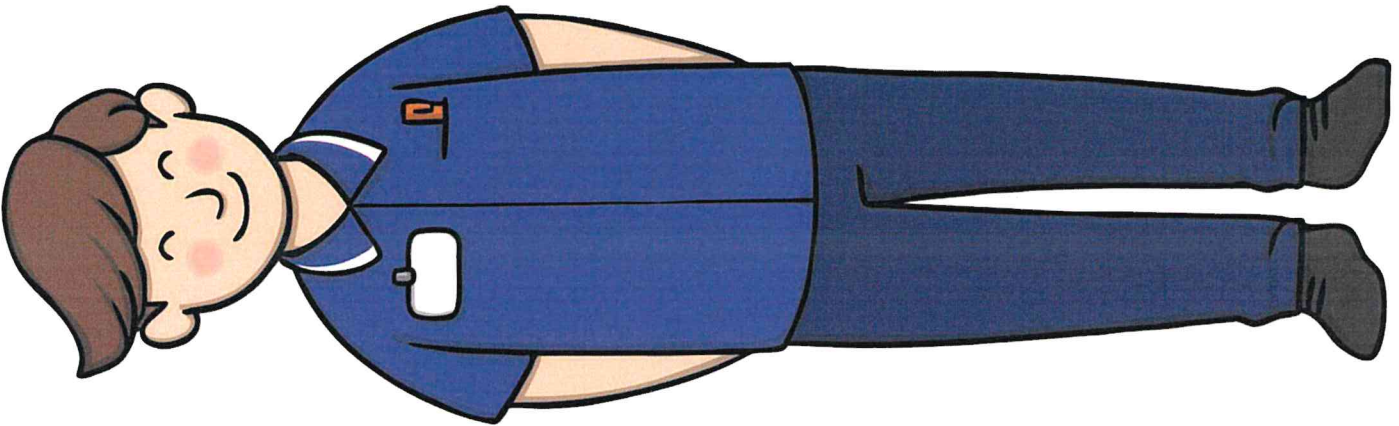


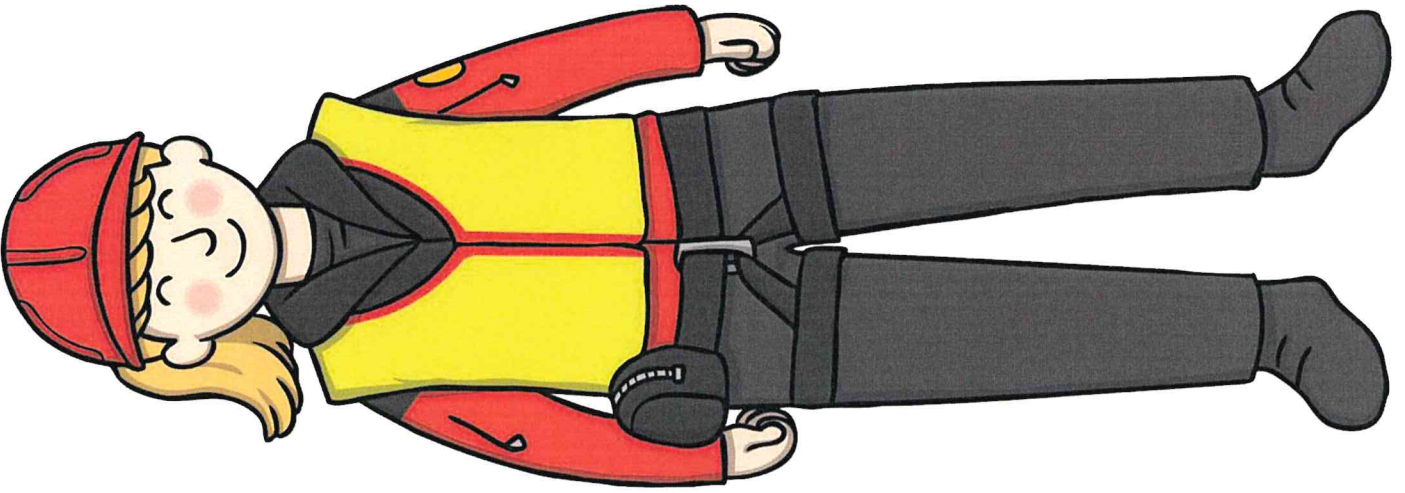
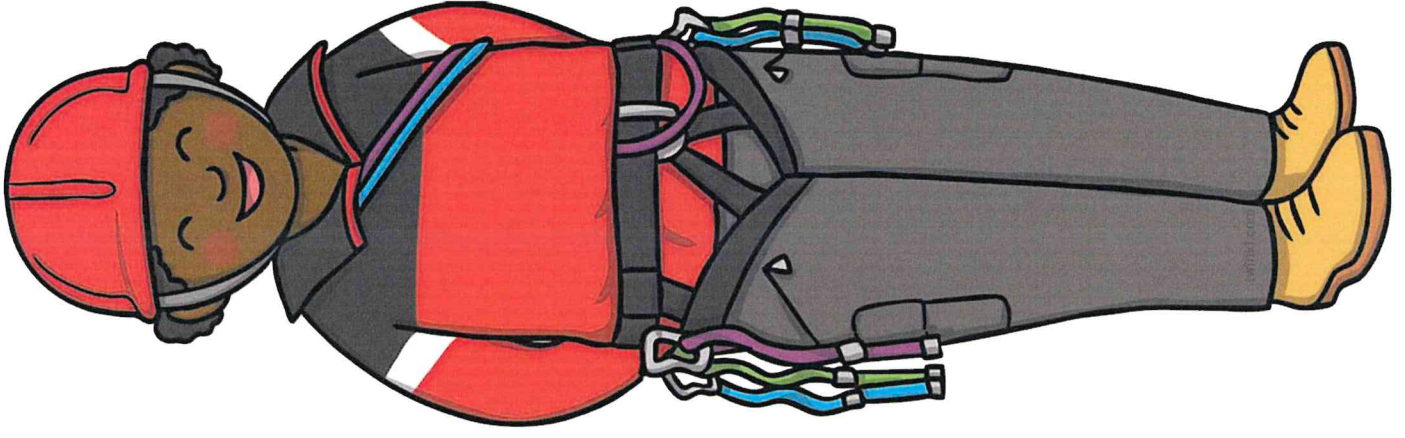


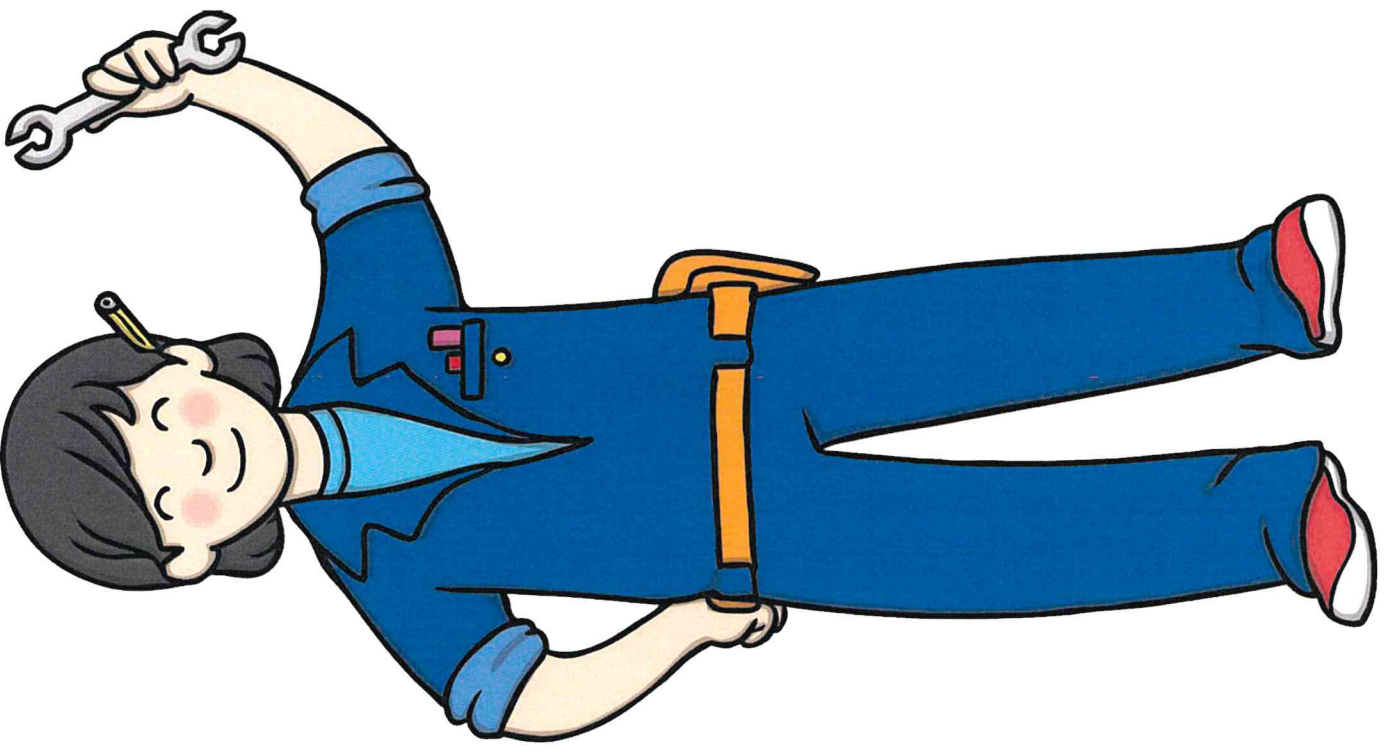
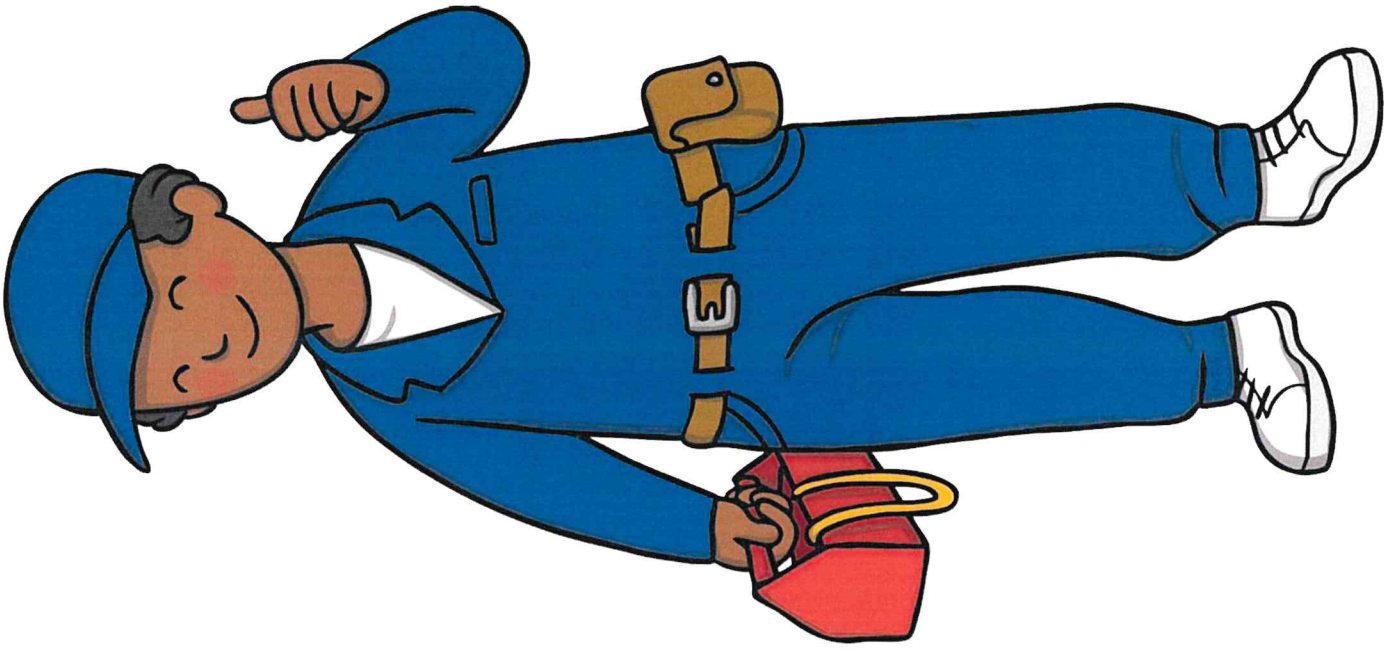


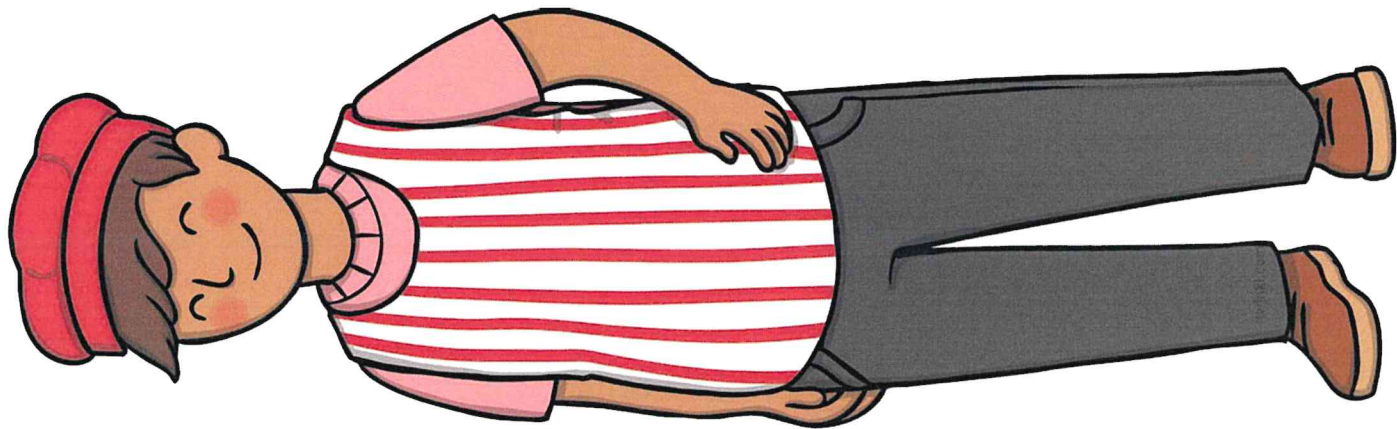


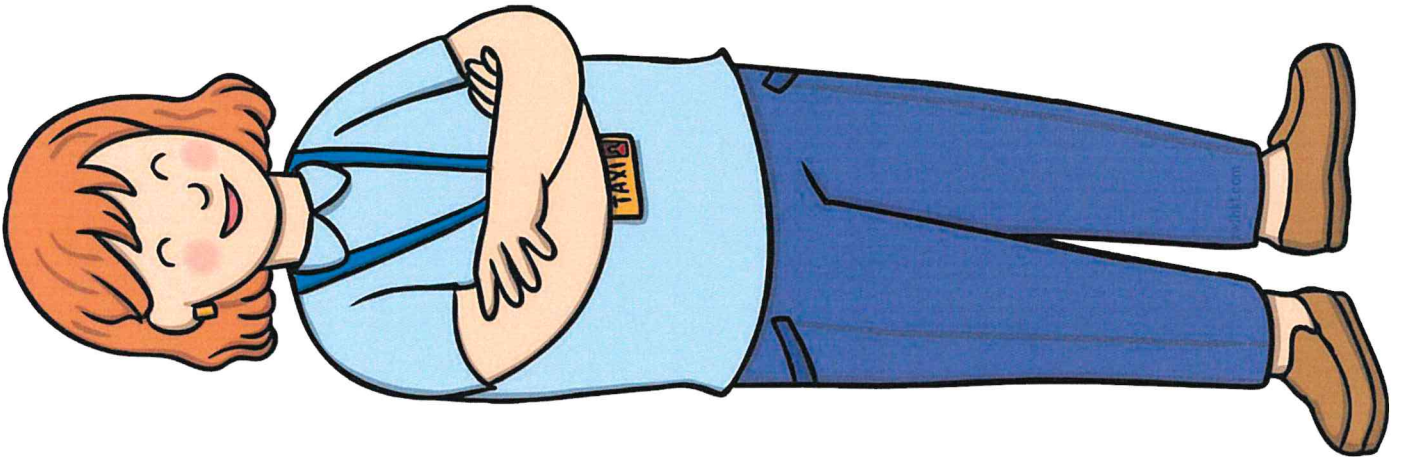
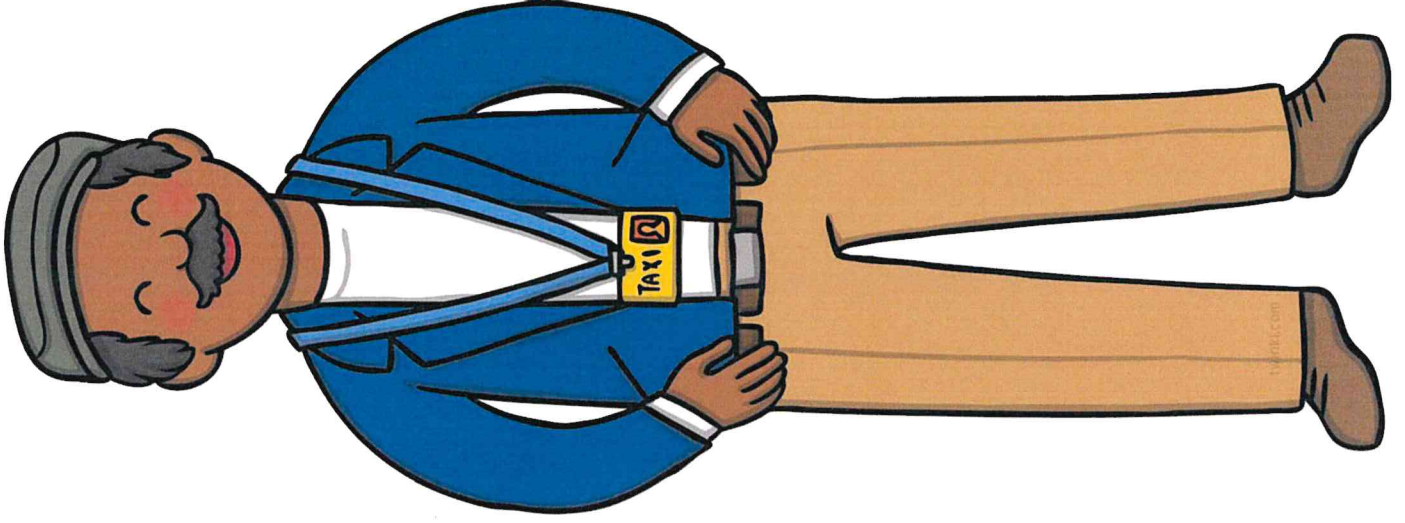


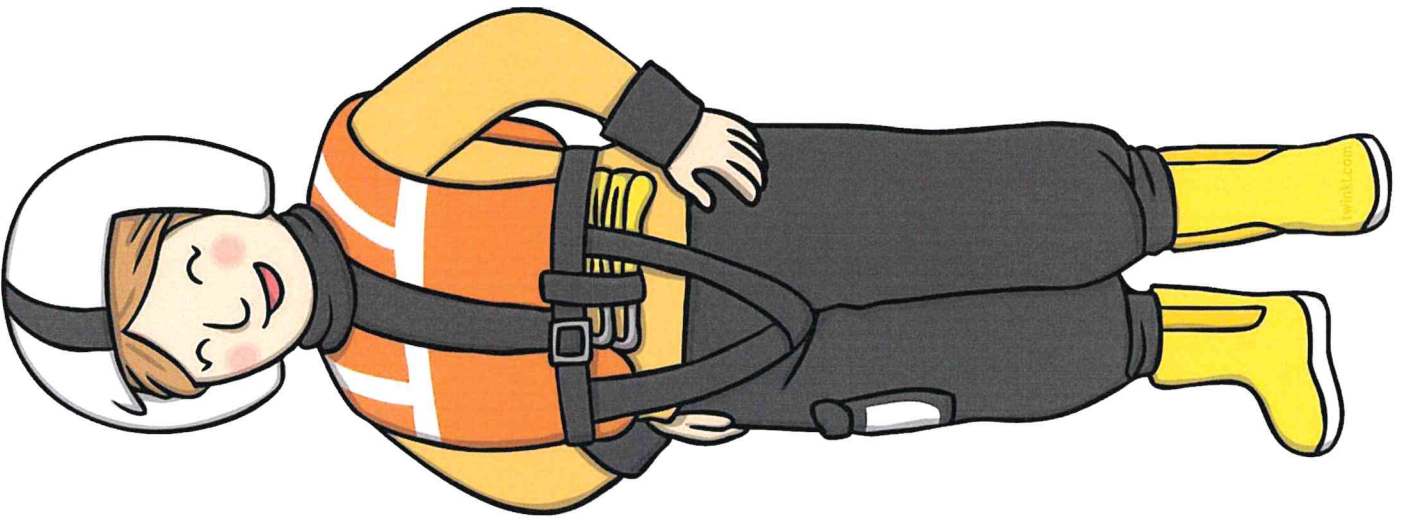
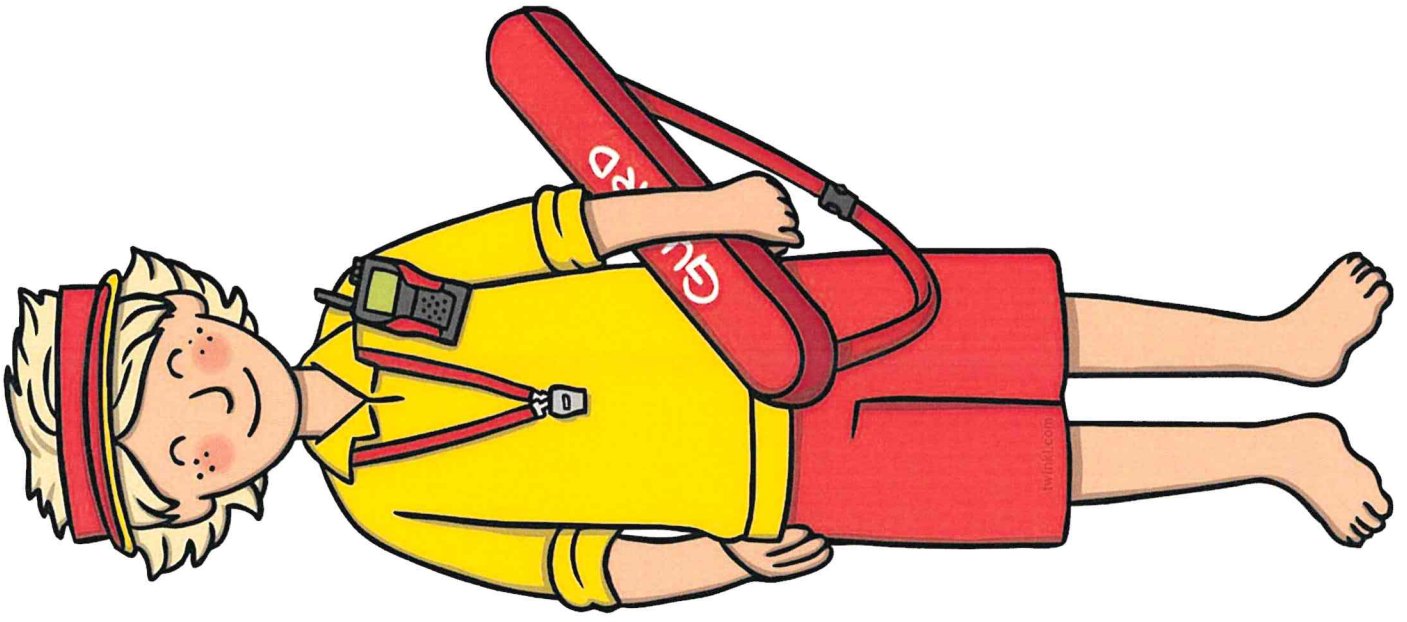


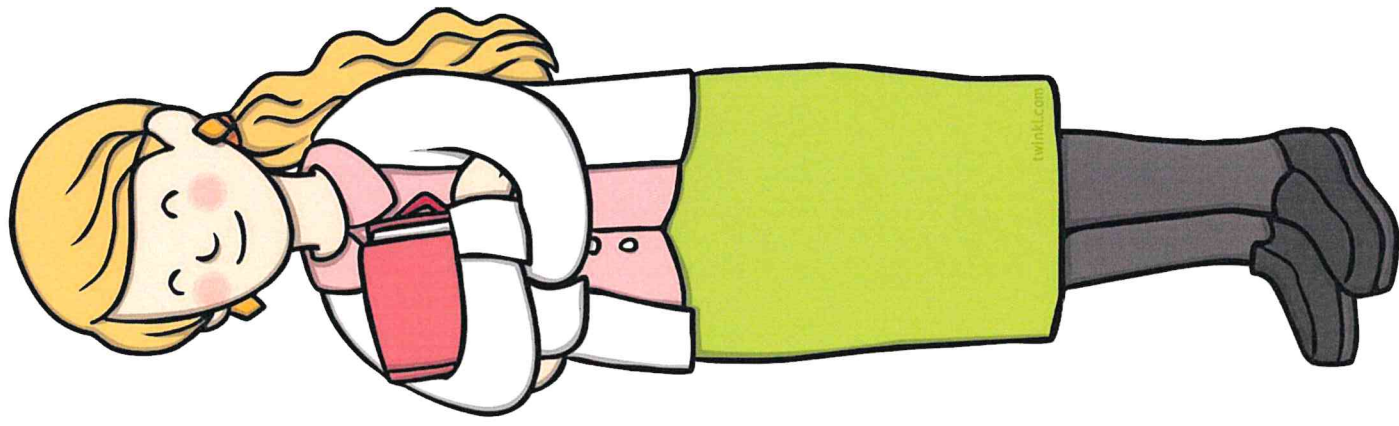
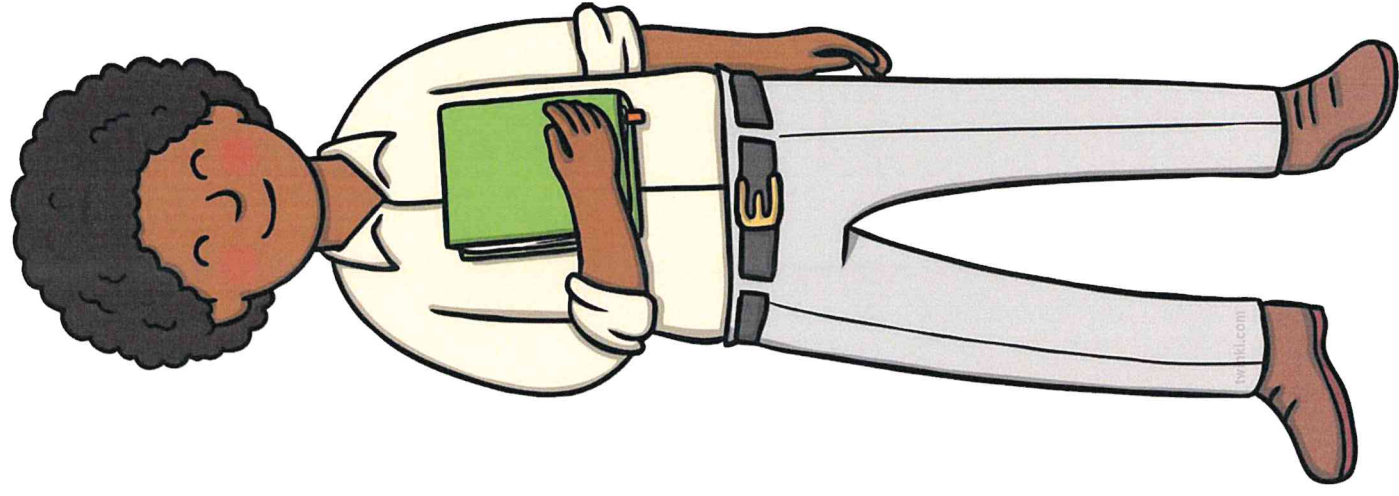


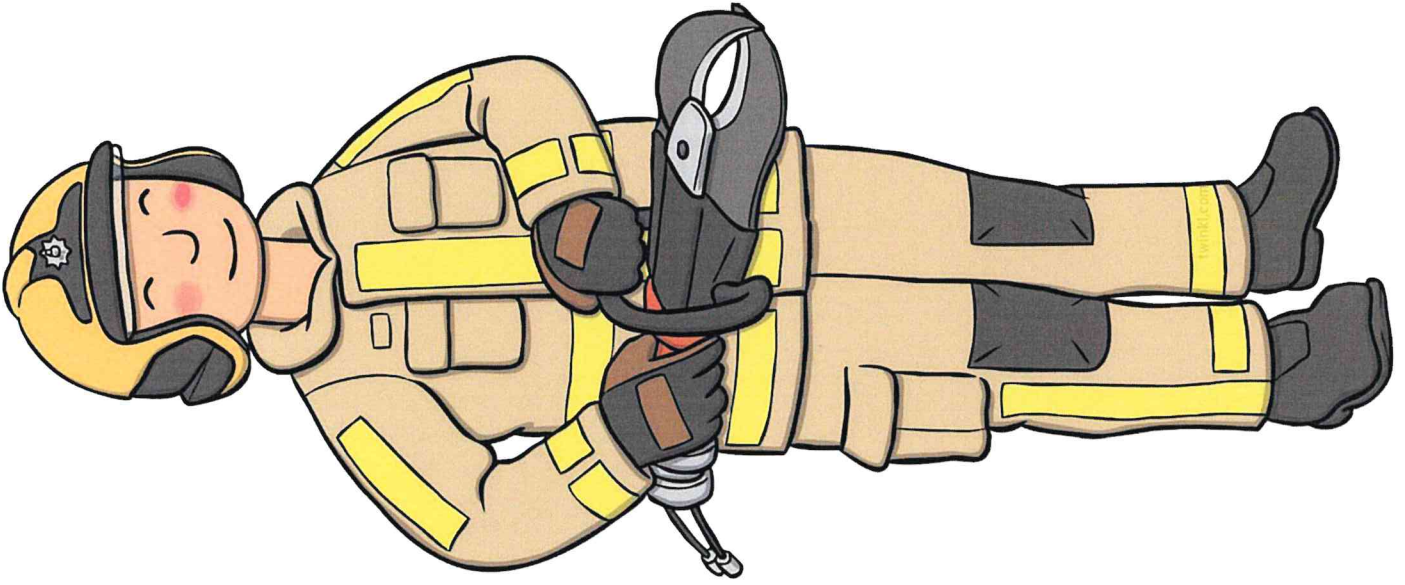
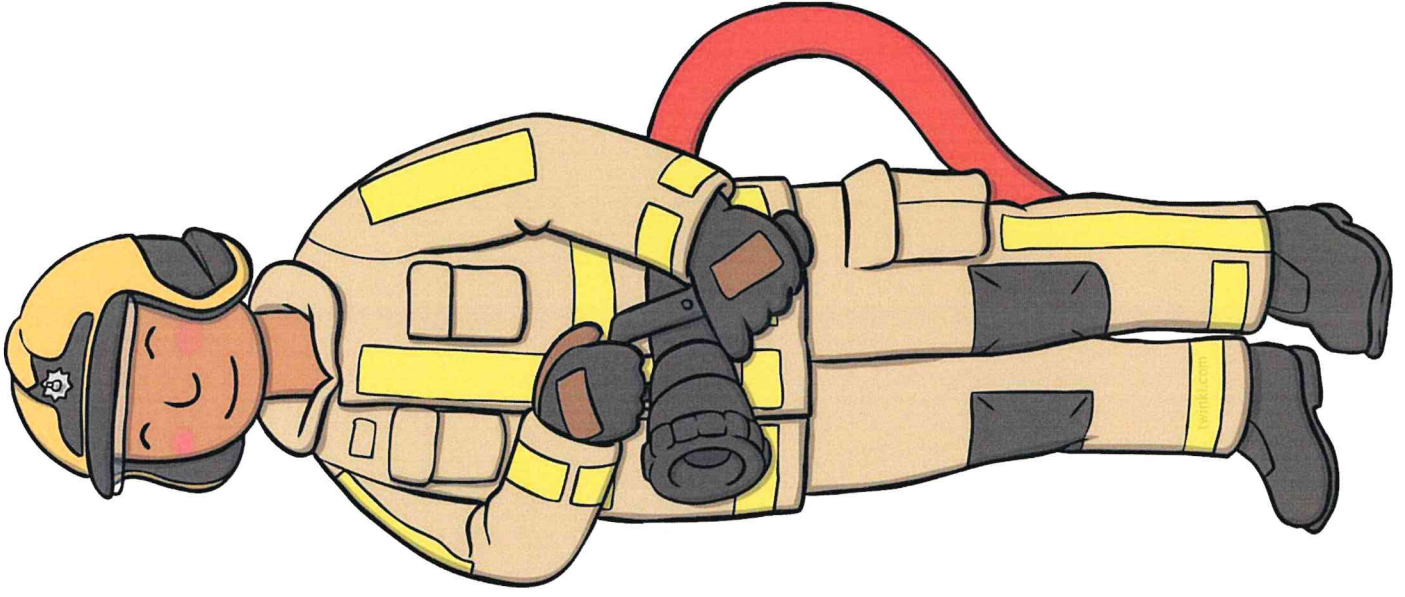


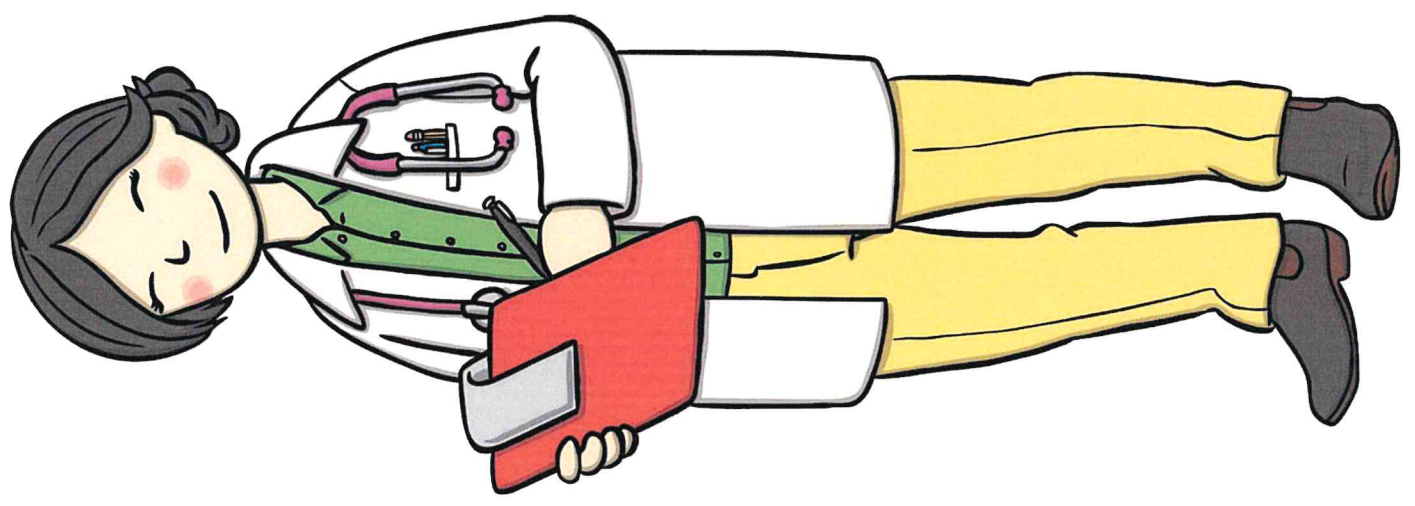
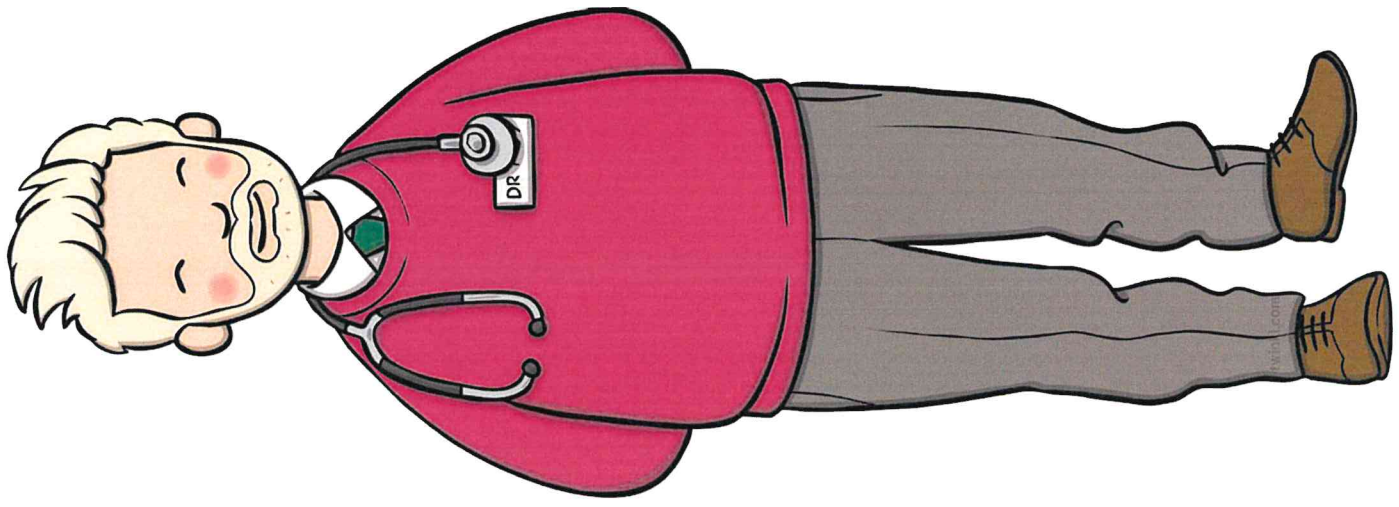


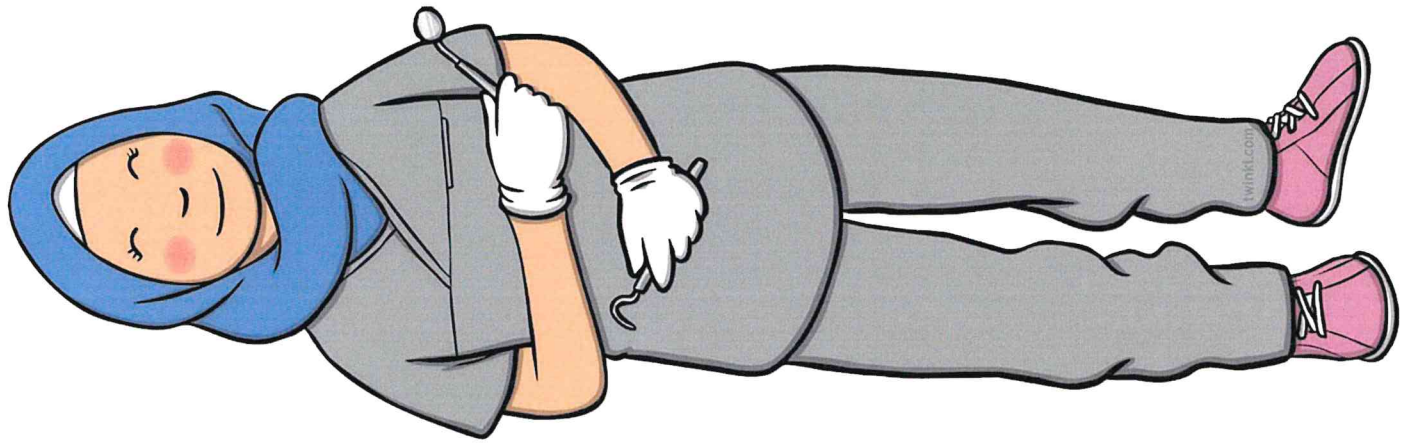
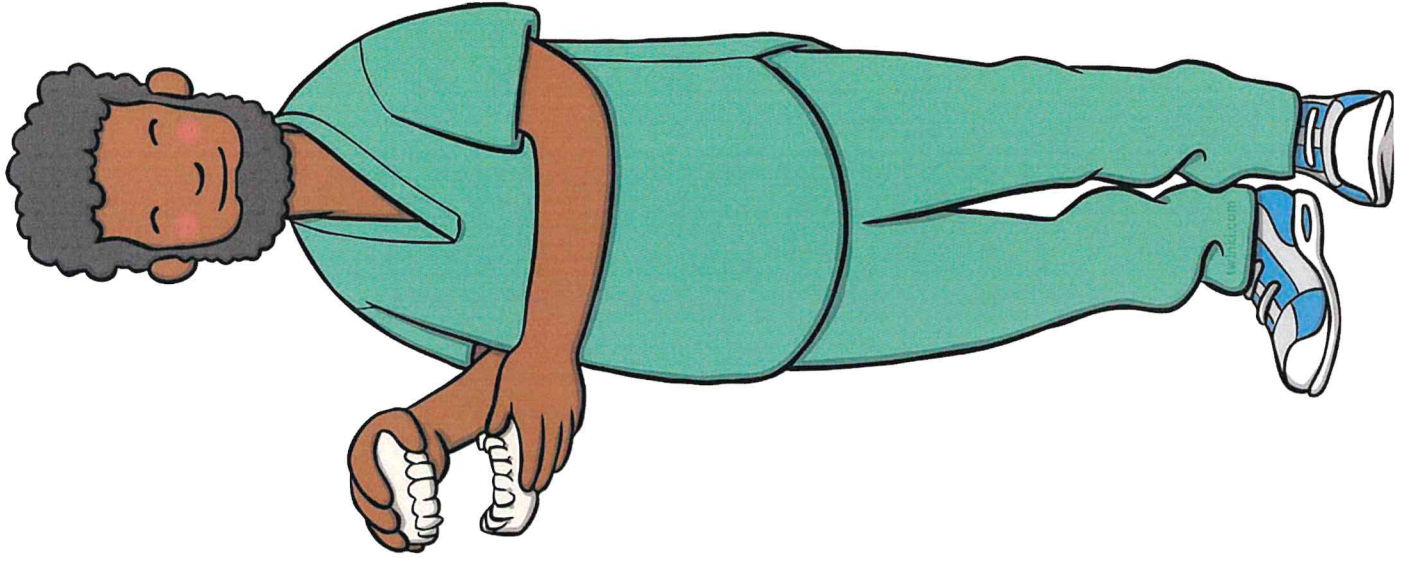


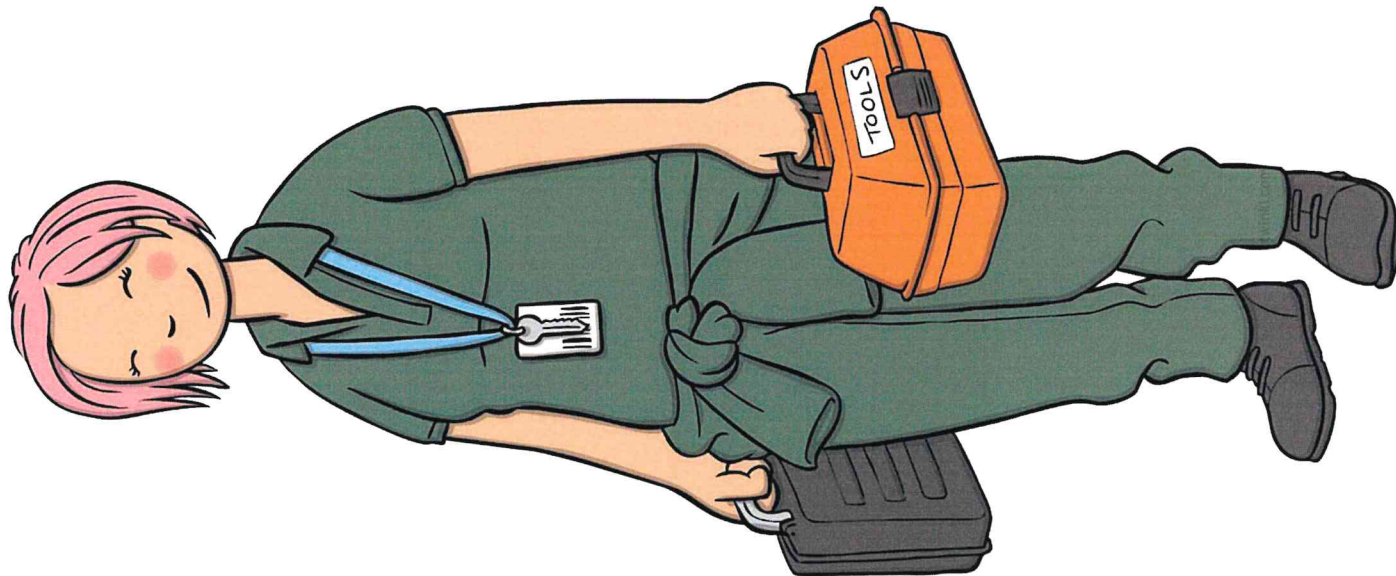
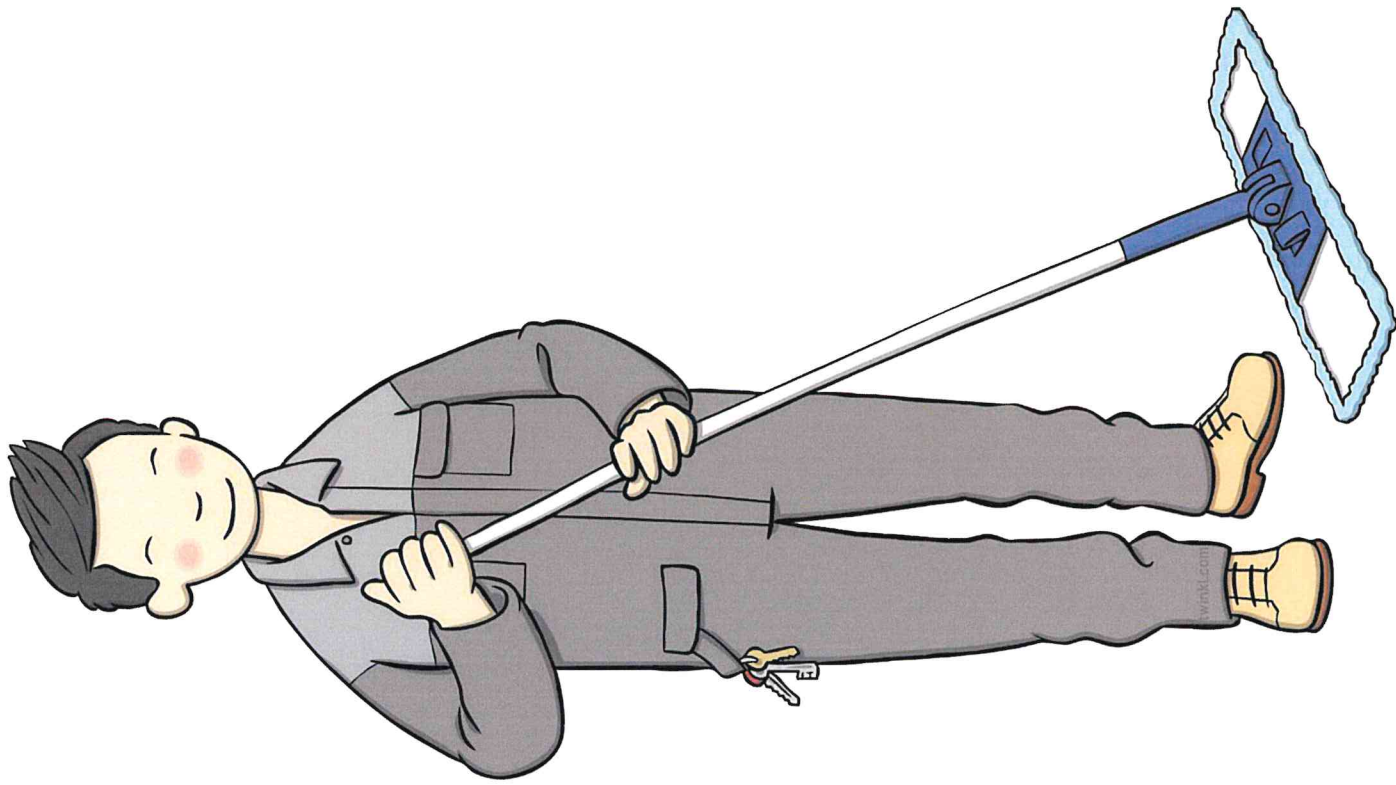


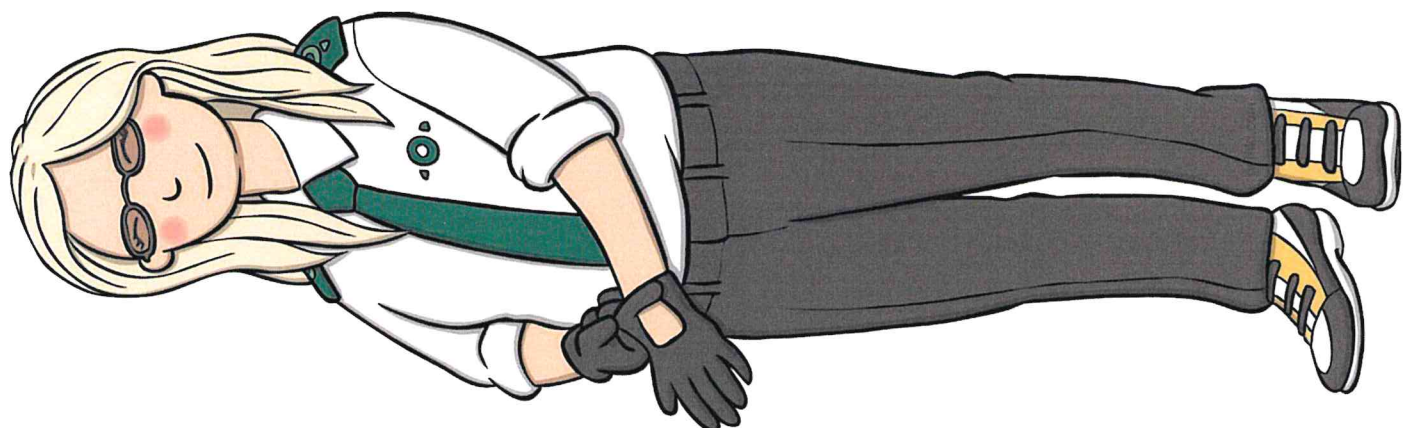
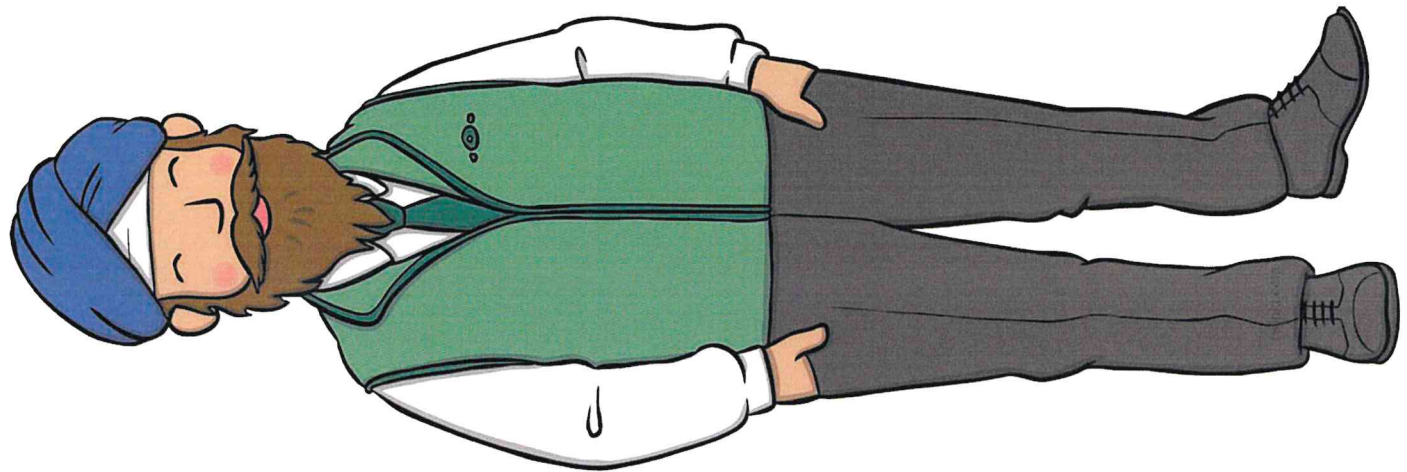


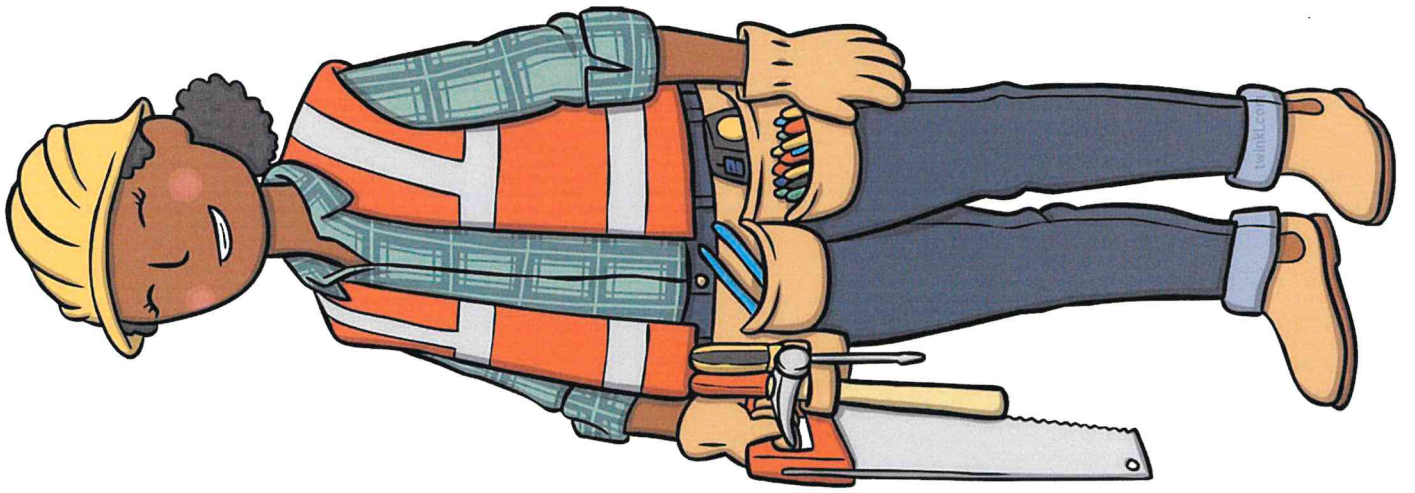
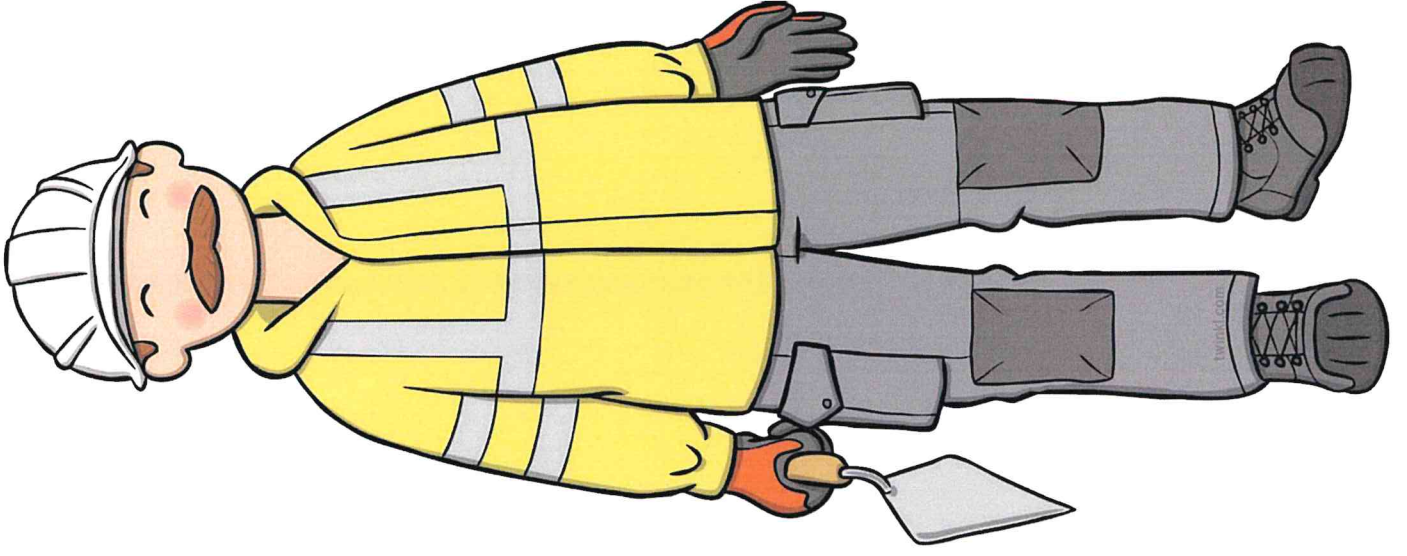


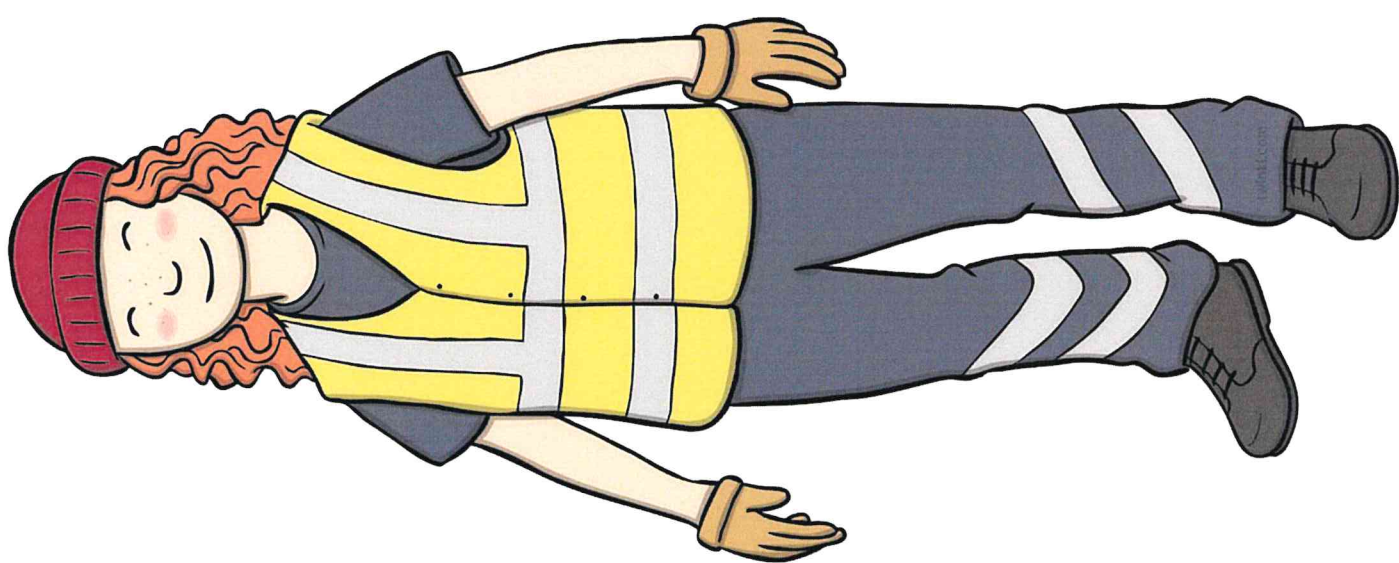
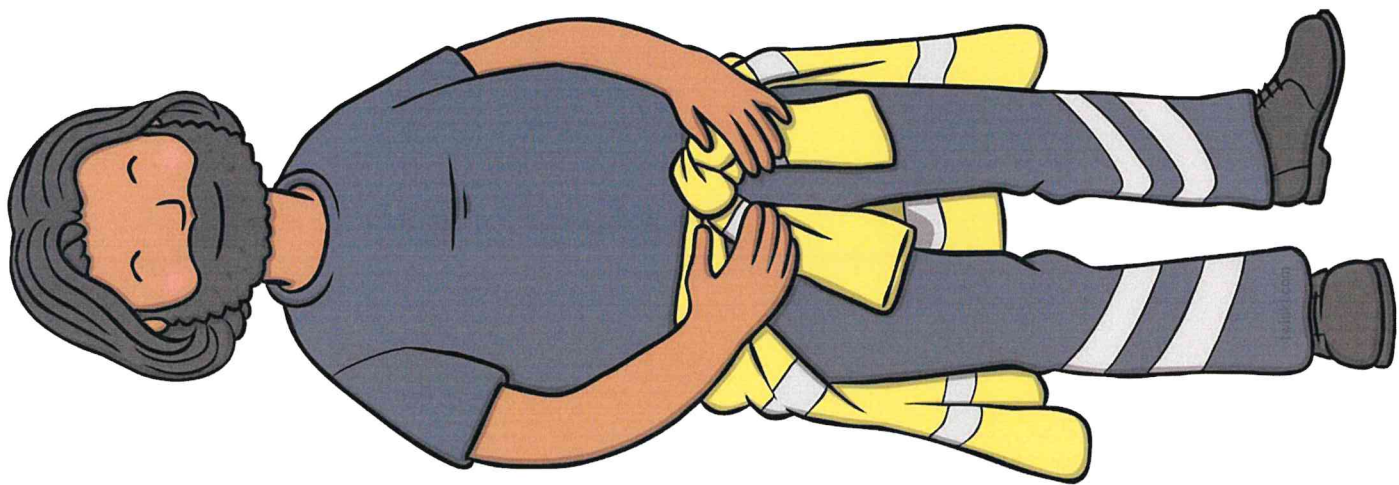




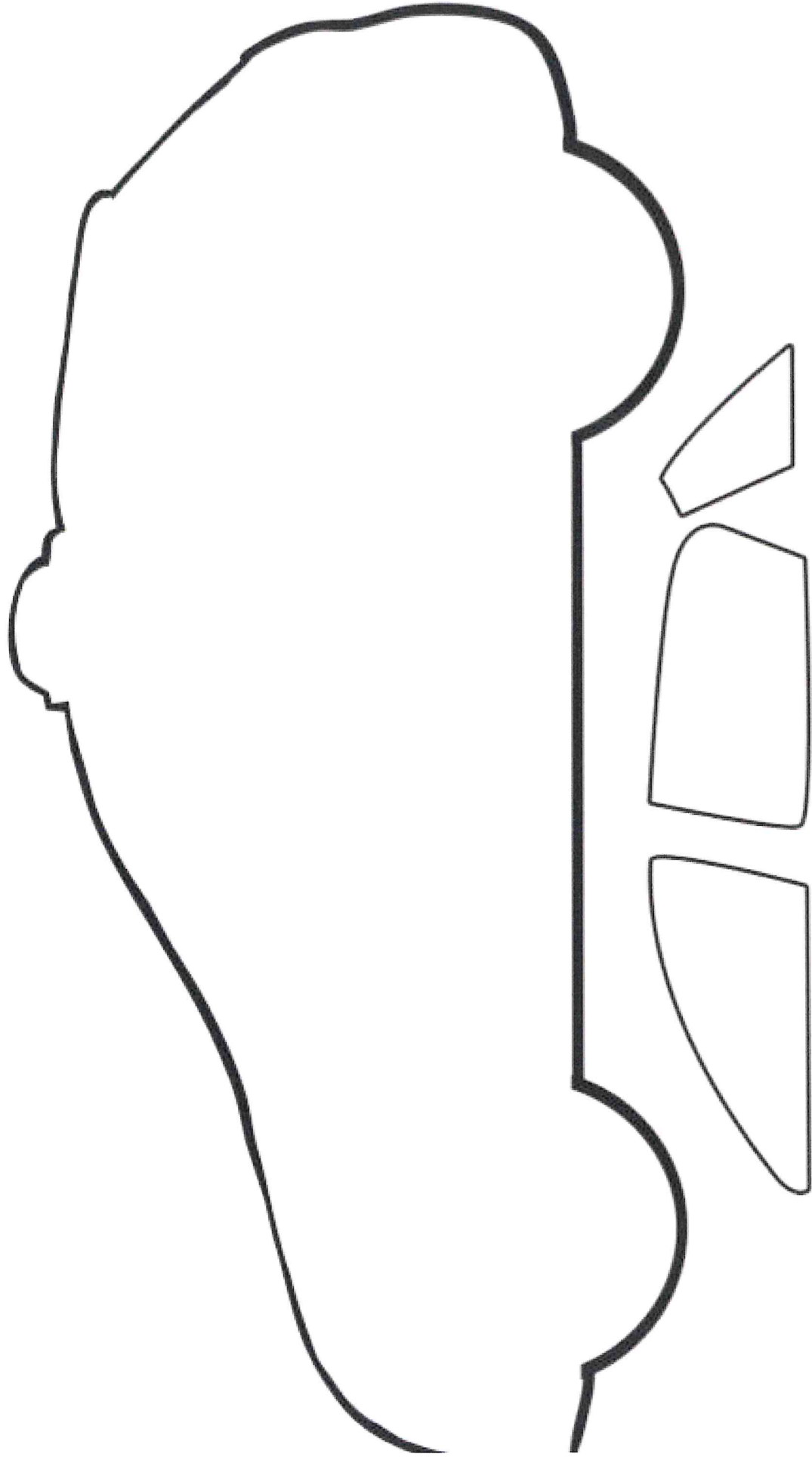


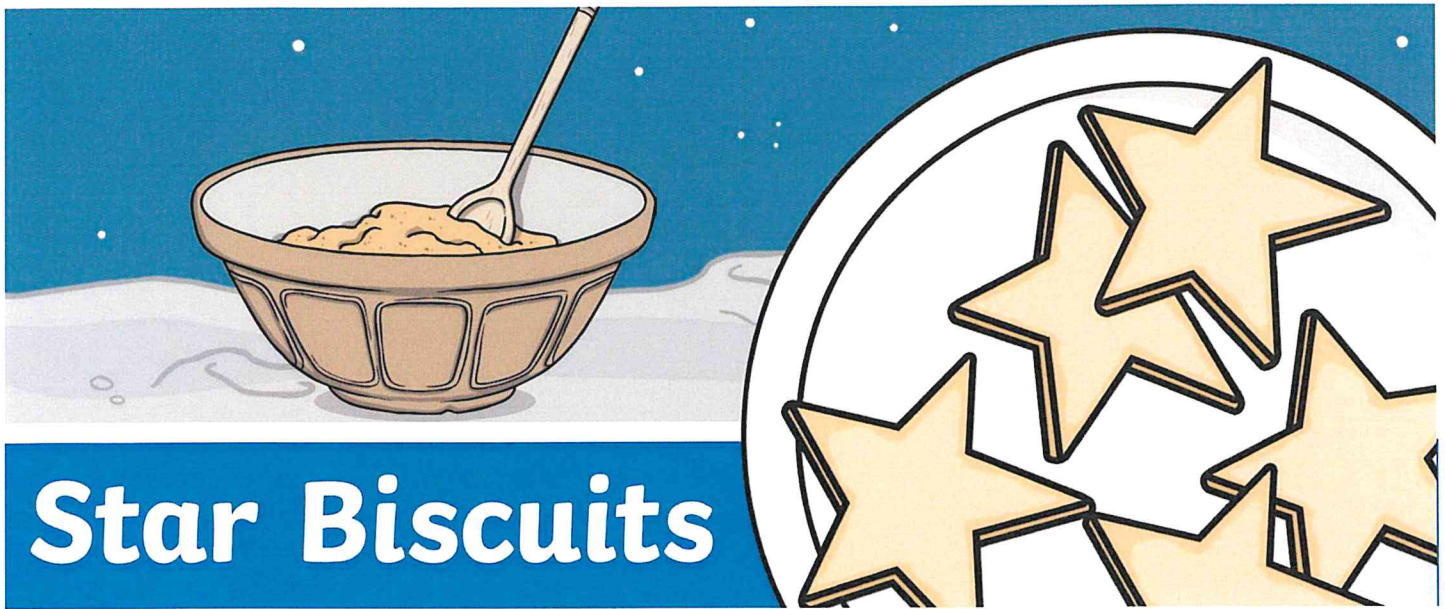






Police Car Template

Spoon

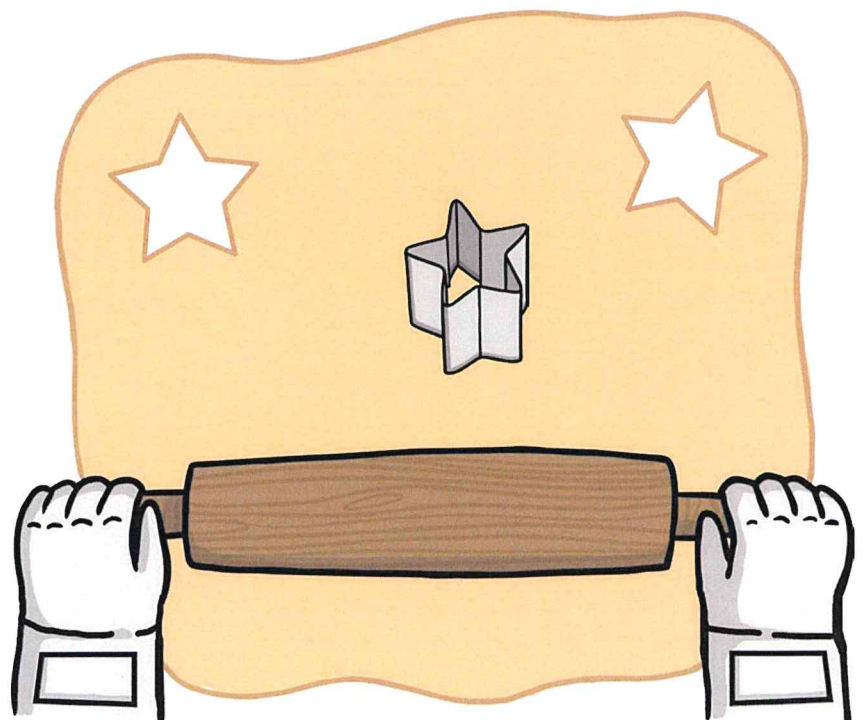

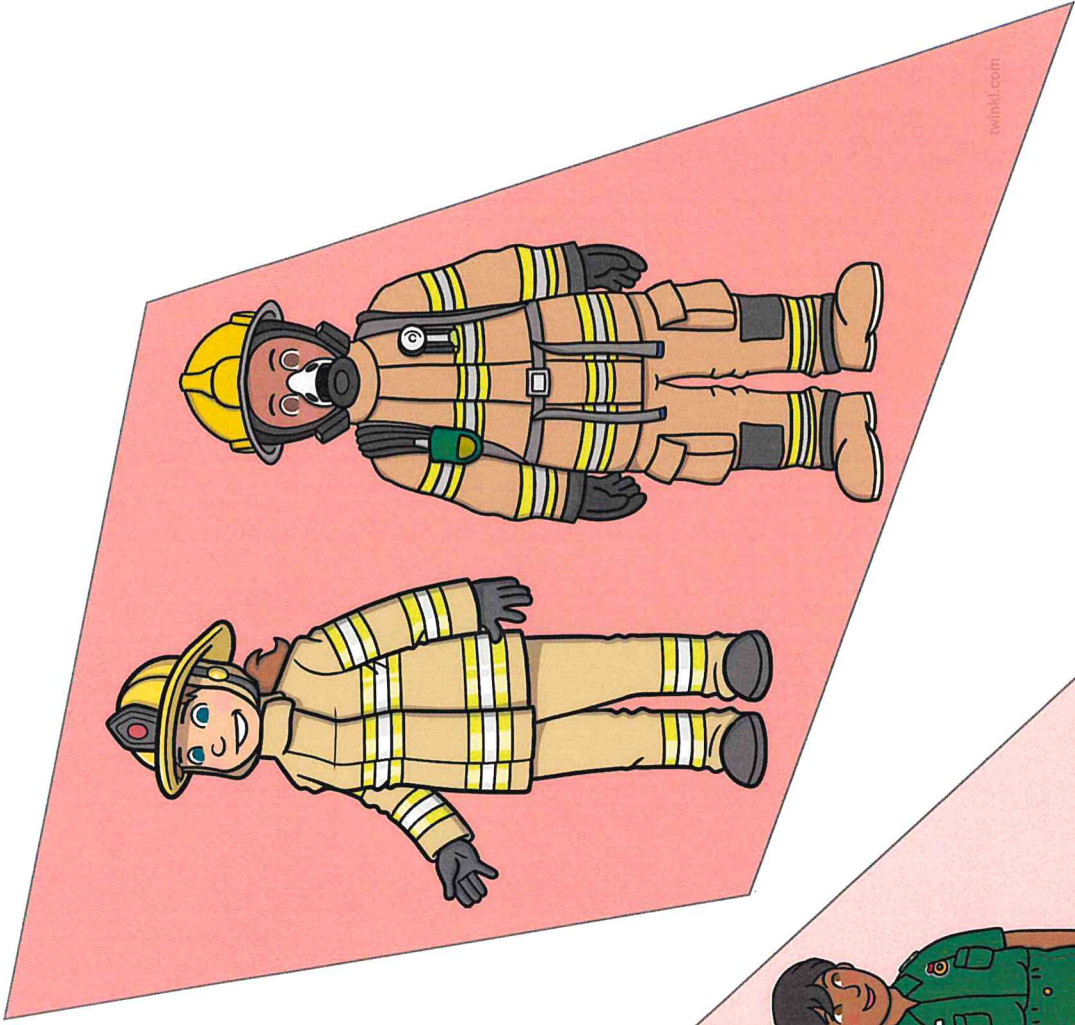
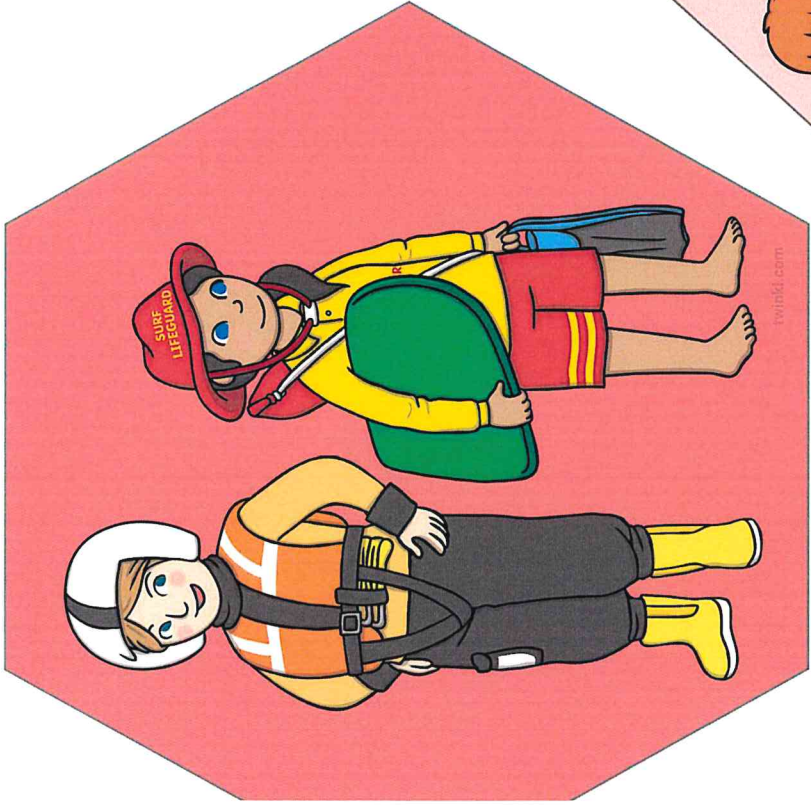
Method

1. Preheat the oven to 150°C.
2. Add butter and sugar in a bowl and mix well until light and fluffy.
3. Add the vanilla, mix, then add the flour and mix well.
4. Roll out to about 5mm thick. Cut into star shapes.
5. Bake for 25 minutes or until golden brown.







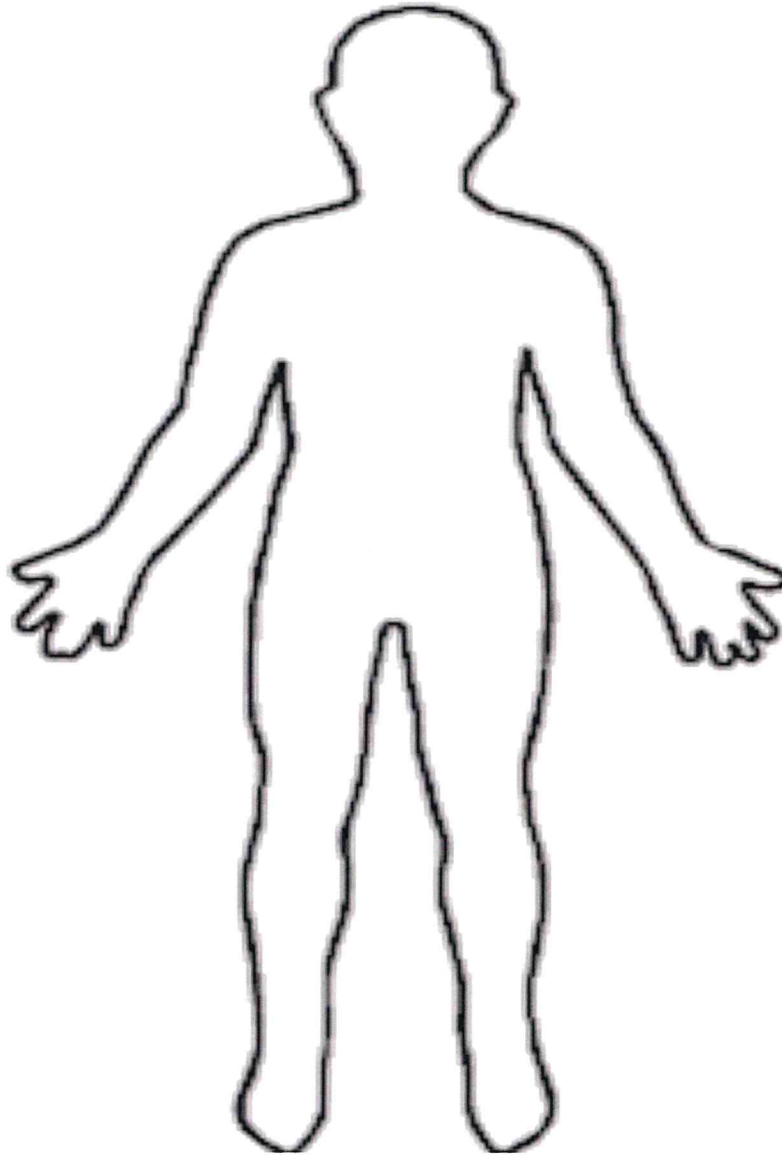
